Mr. Coleman, manager of the Schoedinger-Marr Co., Hardware Store, Columbus, Ohio, desiring to do something for The Ohio State Engineer and also for the engineering students, has offered a prize for the best article written by an engineering student on any engineering subject. The subject is to be chosen by the writer himself, and has no limitations, except that it must be of a technical nature, such as a description of an engineering process, a test on some material or apparatus, or a description of your summer's work.

This contest is open to all sophomore, junior,

and senior students in the College of Engineering. The judges of this contest will be Acting Dean E. F. Coddington, Prof. J. S. Myers, and Mr. Coleman. All articles should be sent to the Editor of The Ohio State Engineer and must be mailed on or before Feb. 20th 1918. Any one wishing to ask any questions may write the editor of The Ohio State Engineer.

The prize has not been definitely decided on, but it will be worth at least \$10. The definite prize will be announced later.

It will assuredly be a prize worth striving for, and besides this the winning article will be published in the March number of The Ohio State Engineer. All other articles, which are deemed worthy by the judges will be published in the magazine sometime during the year.
