
Clouds and Weather Phenomena

The revised edition of this booklet, first published in 1926, contains 42 cloud photographs and a brief text of 24 pages. This little volume is likely to appeal to those who have more than passing interest in the more spectacular atmospheric phenomena such as cloud types, sunsets, rainbows, coronae and halos, and mirages. The author "has written for those not wishing to make a deep study of meteorological matter, yet who take an interest in the changing pageant of the sky."

Chinook winds, tornadoes, cyclones, northern lights, looming and lightning are some of the phenomena that could well have been included under the title without exceeding the author's objective of simplicity.—*John N. Wolfe.*
