Final Highlights of Enrollment for the Summer Quarter of 2005

August 11, 2005

Summer Quarter 2005 began June 20, 2005. A census for the quarter was conducted as of the close of processing on August 8th. The fifteenth day census is the basis for these highlights and the supporting data contained herein.

- An overall decrease in enrollment of 811 compared to Summer Quarter of 2004 was recorded for this quarter. An increase was experienced at Mansfield (up 17 to 463; 3.8%) while Columbus (down 632 to 18,701; -3.3%), Lima (down 42 to 433; -8.8%), Marion (down 75 to 417; -15.2%), Newark (down 55 to 625; -8.1%) and Wooster (down 24 to 150; -13.8%) had decreases in enrollment compared to Summer Quarter 2004. [Table 1].
- Undergraduate enrollment (down 689 to 11,969; -5.4%), graduate professional enrollment (down 56 to 1,034; -5.1%) and graduate enrollment (down 66 to 7,786; -0.8%) all decreased. New first quarter freshman (up 6 to 155; 4.0%) and Transfer students above Rank 2 (up 88 to 676; 15.0%) increased while Transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (down 13 to 123; -9.6%); Continuing students (down 696 to 10,360; -6.3%) and Former students (down 74 to 655; -10.2%) decreased. New from OSU graduate students (up 12 to 676; 1.8%) and Continuing students (up 23 to 5,905; 0.4%) are up while New to OSU graduate students (down 80 to 481; -14.3%) and former graduate students (down 21 to 724; -2.8%) are down. [Table 2].
- Ten undergraduate curricular academic programs at the Columbus campus recorded enrollment shifts of more than fifteen percent compared to last year. These are Arts and Sciences, Unknown (down 7 to 21; -25.0%), The Arts (down 65 to 295; -18.1%); Music (up 10 to 60; 20.0%), Journalism (down 28 to 60; -31.8%), Dental Hygiene (up 15 to 53; 39.5%), Natural Resources (down 15 to 78; -16.1%), Nursing (up 21 to 137; 18.1%), Pharmacy (up 17 to 104; 19.5%) Social Work (up 16 to 59; 37.2%) and USAS (down 108 to 488; -18.1%). Graduate programs with changes in excess of fifteen percent are: Arts and Sciences, General (down 1 to 0; -100.0%), Journalism (down 21 to 0; -100.0%) and Allied Medical Professions (up 47 to 201; 30.5%). The Graduate professional program in Law (down 42 to 144; -22.6%) recorded a change in excess of fifteen percent. [Table 3].
- Credits generated by full time undergraduates at Columbus increased 1.2%; up 920 to 74,699 and the extended campuses decreased 14.1%; down 1,285 to 7,839. The total decrease in full-time undergraduate credit hours was 365, down 0.4% from the Summer of 2004. Overall, part-time credit hours decreased (down 4,184 to 43,995; -8.7%). Both the Columbus campus (-8.5%) and the extended campuses (-9.7%) experienced a decrease in total part-time credit hours. Overall, the total number of credit hours decreased 4,549 to 126,533 (down 3.5%) while the credits per student increased to 10.57 (up 0.22; 2.1%). With the decrease in the total number of graduate students, the total number of graduate credit hours decreased as well, down 2,321 to 75,573 (-3.0%). Full-time graduate credit hours decreased 3.9% to 53,454 on the Columbus campus and 12.8% to 963 on the extended campuses as a whole yielding an overall full-time graduate credit hour decrease of 4.1% to 54,417. Graduate credits per student for the entire university were down 0.21 to 9.71 (-2.2%). Graduate professional credit hours were down 12 to 16,313, (-0.1%) and credits per student were up 5.3% to 15.78. Undergraduate FTE decreased from 8,739 from Summer 2004 to 8,435. Graduate professional FTE decreased from 1,088. to 1,087. Graduate FTE decreased to 5,038 from 5,193. [Table 4]

- For the total university, twenty eight counties recorded enrollment changes (positive or negative) in excess of twenty percent from last Summer; Adams (down 66.7%), Brown (down 30.0%), Carroll (down 29.4%), Champaign (up 40.0%), Clinton (down 31.4%), Columbiana (down 33.8%), Coshocton (down 30.6%), Darke (down 42.1%) Erie (up 25.4%), Gallia (up 50.0%), Hancock (down 21.8%), Henry (up 37.5%), Highland (up 21.1%), Hocking (down 30.4%), Holmes (down 23.8%), Lawrence (up 31.0%), Meigs (up 22.2%), Morgan (up 40.0%), Ottawa (down 24.4%), Paulding (up 27.8%), Pike (down 39.3%), Portage (down 25.6%), Preble (up 23.1%), Scioto (down 28.8%), Seneca (down 26.6%), Shelby (down 30.6%), Vinton (up 133.3%) and Warren (up 26.6%). For the Columbus campus, thirty two counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent: Adams (down 66.7%), Ashland (down 21.4%), Brown (down 40.0%), Carroll (down 29.4%), Champaign (up 33.3%), Clinton (down 35.3%), Columbiana (down 30.4%), Coshocton (down 24.2%), Darke (down 40.5%), Erie (up 24.2%), Fulton (up 20.8%), Gallia (up 42.9%), Hancock (down 21.2%), Harrison (up 40.0%), Henry (up 20.7%), Hocking (down 27.3%), Holmes (down 46.2%), Jackson (down 26.7%), Lawrence (up 35.7%), Meigs (up 22.2%), Monroe (down 22.2%), Ottawa (down 23.7%), Paulding (up 50.0%), Pike (down 38.5%), Portage (down 27.5%), Preble (up 23.1%), Scioto (down 29.3%), Seneca (down 29.3%), Union (down 20.7%), Vinton (up 133.3%), Warren (up 27.6%) and Wyandote (down 22.2%). - For the total university, the states and territories with enrollment that changed in excess of twenty percent from last Summer were: Utah (up 23.9%), Massachusetts (up 33.3%), Tennessee (down 23.7%), Colorado (up 34.4%), Arizona (up 37.9%), Oregon (up 30.8%), Louisiana (down 25.8%), Idaho (up 43.8%), Puerto Rico (down 33.3%), Nebraska (up 54.5%), Arkansas (up 112.5%), Hawaii (down 33.3%), Mississippi (up 22.2%), Delaware (down 33.3%), Montana (up 60.0%), South Dakota (up 66.7%), and Nevada (down 60.0%). At Columbus, the states and territories with enrollment that increased or decreased in excess of twenty percent from last Summer were: Utah (up 25.3%), Massachusetts (up 31.1%), Tennessee (down 22.4%), Colorado (up 38.7%), Arizona (up 37.9%), Oregon (up 30.8%), Louisiana (down 25.8%), Idaho (up 43.8%), Puerto Rico (down 33.3%), Nebraska (up 54.5%), Arkansas (up 112.5%), Hawaii (down 29.4%), Mississippi (up 22.2%), Delaware (down 33.3%), Montana (up 60.0%), South Dakota (up 150.0%) and Nevada (down 60.0%). [Table 7 and Table 8]
- Of the twenty-five countries with the largest representation of students enrolled at Ohio State, Indonesia (down 24.8%), Romania (down 24.3%), Argentina (up 42.9%), Russia (down 31.8%), and Philippines (up 66.7%) recorded changes in enrollment in excess of twenty percent from last Summer Quarter. People's Republic of China, Republic of Korea, India and Taiwan recorded enrollment of 100 or more students this quarter. [Table 9]
- Continuing Education had an international enrollment of 6.8 percent. Undergraduate curricular academic programs with international student enrollment in excess of five percent were Biological Sciences (5.6%), Math and Physical Sciences (9.2%), Business (15.2%), Engineering (13.5%) and Architecture (5.6%). Forty percent or more of the graduate students in Biological Sciences (49.1%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (49.2%), Engineering (64.4%), Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (43.0%), Pharmacy (74.4%) and Veterinary Medicine (45.2%) were international students. International graduate student enrollment at Columbus was 1,875 and the total university was 1,877. International graduate professional student enrollment was 10. [Table 10]
- Summer Quarter record high enrollments among African Americans (1,670 total) and Non Resident Alien Professional students (10 total) were reached this quarter. [Tables 11, 12, and 13]
- At the undergraduate level, enrollment of Ohio residents decreased 5.2% (down 591 to 10,685) while enrollment of not-Ohio residents decreased 7.1% (down 98 to 1,284). Graduate enrollment of Ohio residents decreased (down 120 to 4,511; -2.6%) and not-Ohio residents increased (up 54 to 3,275; 1.7%). Graduate professional enrollment of Ohio residents decreased 60 to 969 (down 5.8%) and not-Ohio residents increased 4 to 65 (up 6.6%). [Table 14]
