Edward C. Sargent, is engineer in the Department of Public Works for the City of Lakewood, Ohio.

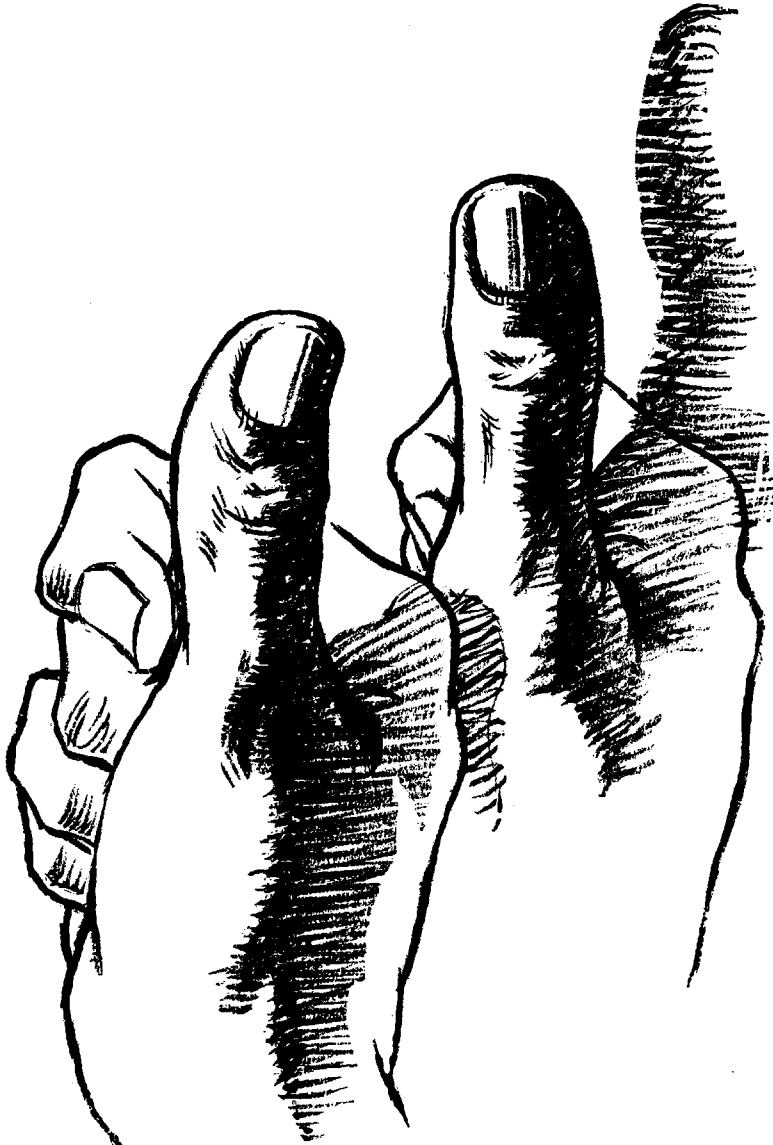
J. L. Gotschall, '07, is on the Corps of engineers of the A. C. & Y. Railroad at Akron, Ohio.
