Thursday, October 3 - *A Place of Rage*

This film, produced and directed by Pratibha Parma, interviews African American women Angela Davis, Alice Walker and June Jordan. It reassesses how women such as Rosa Parks and Fannie Lou Hamer revolutionized American Society. A 1970 prison interview, civil rights footage and archival photos of Angela Davis, interwoven with June Jordan's poetry, links issues of homophobia, racism, U.S. imperialism and liberation struggles worldwide. The film provides insights of the acclaimed writer Alice Walker and filmmaker Trinh T. Minh-ha. National Black Programming Consortium, Best Historical Documentary.

Thursday, October 10 - *Silent Pioneers*

Produced by Pioneer Films, this presentation traces the history of the gay movement in America by interviewing older gay men and women. It observes the similarities and differences between today's standards and those of generations past. The film emphasizes the extreme lack of tolerance for gays in the past.

Thursday, October 17 - *Women Like Us*

This film, produced by S. Neil, looks at the changing lives of lesbians since the 1920s. It examines 16 lesbians, aged from 50 to 80, who live in various parts of Britain, and from different races, classes and backgrounds. They relate their lives and experiences of being a lesbian. *Ohio Union Gray Suite G - 11:30 a.m.-1:00 p.m.*

Thursday, October 24 - *Romantic Friendship*

Leila Rupp, Professor of History at The Ohio State University, will give a presentation on Romantic Friendship, followed by discussions with the audience.

Thursday, October 31 - *The Word is Out*

This motion picture records interviews with 16 gay men and women about their personal feelings, experiences and social reactions to their relationships. The film notes that homosexuals have been viewed as sick by the medical community, as criminals by the police, and as wicked by religious groups.

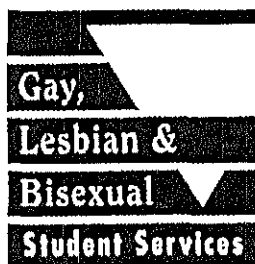

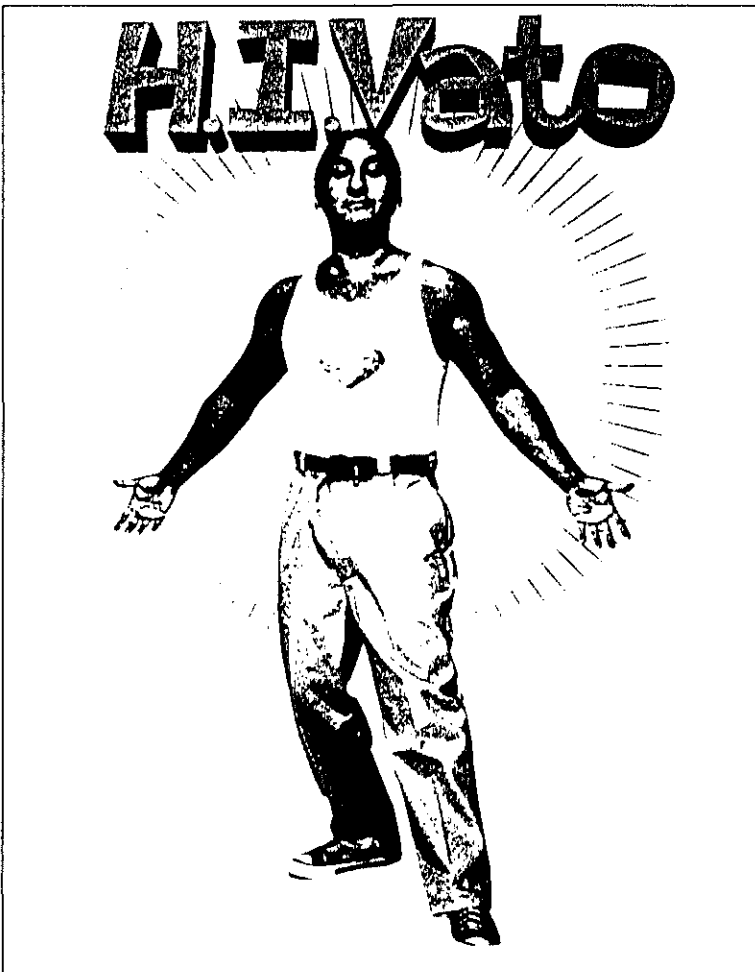

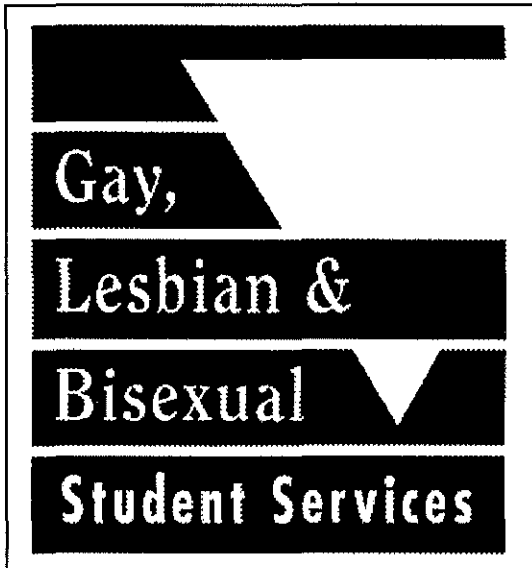
