Wood frame with wood exterior.

3.2 No. of stories:

One.

B. PLANNING AND CONSTRUCTION

1. On Feb. 14, 1944 the Board of Trustees approved the plans and related documents prepared by Howard Dwight Smith and authorized the solicitation of bids by contractors.
2. Bids were received on February 29, 1944 (T). Bids for the general contract were rejected and the plumbing bids were held over for later action.
3. New general contract bids were received on March 13, 1944 (T).
4. On April 3, 1944 the Board of Trustees approve the Cabinet action of March 14, 1944 awarding contracts to the following contractors:

General: H. M. Boyajohn & Associates
Plumbing: North Side Plumbing Co.

5. Completion and occupancy:

Final estimates are dated May 12, 1944 (A).

C. COST

Listed at \$35,648.13 (B).

D. DEMOLITION

The Board of Trustees on February 4, 1972 authorized demolition of the building.
