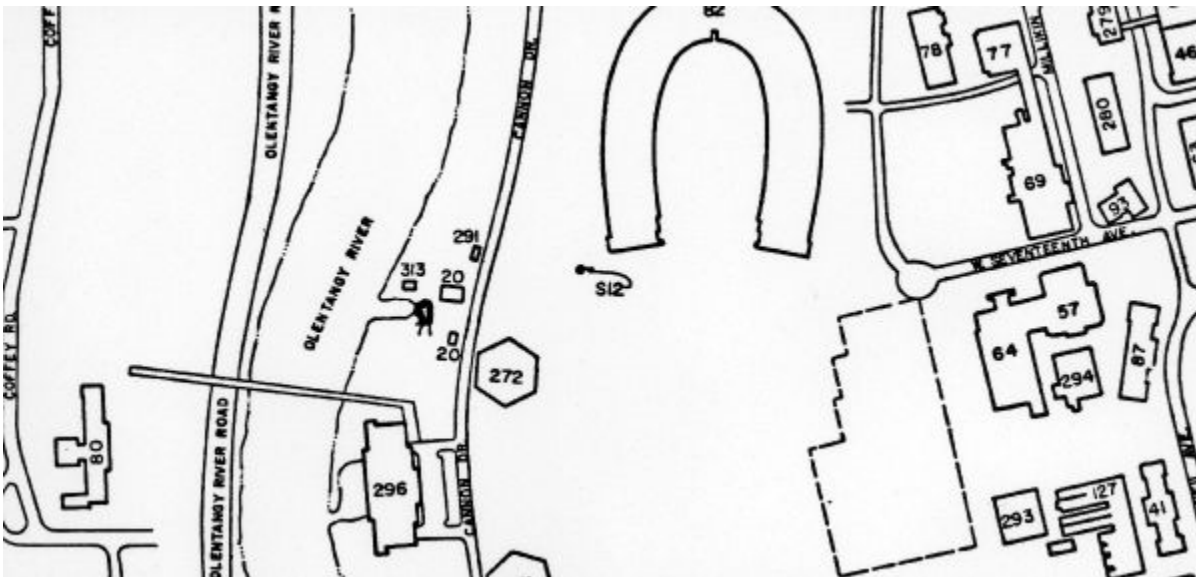

3. General Description

3.1 Type of construction:

Reinforced concrete.

3.2 No. of stories:

One.

3.3 Increments of construction:

No additions.

3.4 Present area of building as shown in inventory records of Division of Campus Planning:

1,647 sq. ft. gross; 59 sq. ft. net assignable; 1380 sq. ft. mechanical

B. PLANNING & CONSTRUCTION

1. On July 6, 1925 the Board of Trustees approved the plans and related documents prepared by William C. Mc Cracken and authorized the solicitation of bids by contractors. Note: Although original drawings bear the name of William C. Mc Cracken, later detailed drawings bear the name of Joseph N. Bradford. Mr. Paul H. Elleman, who was on Mc Cracken's staff at the time, states that Bradford designed the building and supervised its construction.

2. Bids were received on August 11, 1925 (A).

3. On August 17, 1925 the Board of Trustees awarded the contract to E. H. Latham Co.

4. Completion and occupancy:

4.1 In October 1925, Bradford estimated that the building would be completed by December 1 (L 10/14/25).

4.2 The final estimate, however, is dated April 29, 1927 (A). The delay was probably due to installation of pumps and other equipment. Also, according to Paul H. Elleman, the contractor had considerable difficulty keeping river water out of the construction area.

C. COST

1. Latham contract was for \$9,067, which was probably for the building only.

2. Carried on books at \$27,054.47 since 1930 (B). Most of this is probably for the pumps and other mechanical equipment.
