

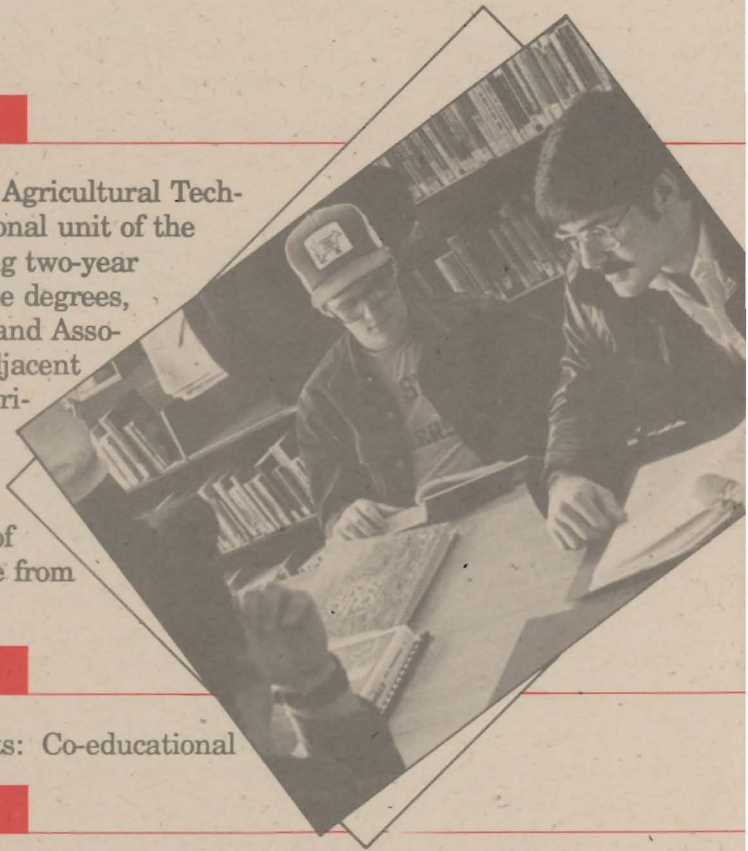

## OSU/ATI FACTS

### THE INSTITUTE

The Ohio State University Agricultural Technical Institute is an instructional unit of the College of Agriculture, offering two-year courses of study leading to the degrees, Associate of Applied Science and Associate of Technical Studies. Adjacent to the campus of the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center (OARDC) in Wooster, Ohio, OSU/ATI is situated 30 miles southwest of Akron and is easily accessible from all parts of Ohio.



### THE INSTITUTE SIZE

Approximately 750 students: Co-educational

### FACILITIES

The 50-acre central campus includes three major buildings, an ornamental horticulture complex, and a residence hall. Nearby facilities include a 1,817 acre farm laboratory which houses the beef, swine and dairy operations. The horse facility contains horse barns and an indoor/outdoor horse arena.

### ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Throughout the two years, students take a blend of general courses and technical studies in their field of specialization. In technical courses, a hands-on, practical approach is emphasized. The OSU/ATI faculty has extensive industry experience and more than 50% of them hold doctoral degrees. The student/faculty ratio is approximately 15:1.

### INTERNSHIP

Occupational internship is a requirement of each technology and consists of ten to sixteen weeks of full-time, paid, employment in the student's field of study. The student is graded on job performance and receives academic credit while being paid by his employer.

## PLACEMENT

Placement of OSU/ATI graduates in their field of study has been exceptionally good. The most recent 11 year study shows a 96.5% placement record in 120 days of graduation. For current figures in specific programs; contact the OSU/ATI Placement Office.

## FINANCIAL AID

Every effort is made to help qualified students with limited financial resources secure the needed funds. Refer to the OSU/ATI Financial Aid sheet or the Agricultural Technical Institute bulletin for more detailed information about financial aid.

## ADMISSION

Information on admission and on academic programs may be requested from the OSU/ATI Admissions Office. Students may apply for admission for any quarter. Most students new to OSU/ATI begin in the Autumn Quarter.

Prior to admission, students should arrange a personal conference with the faculty member representing their field of interest. Refer to the Agricultural Technical Institute application bulletin for additional information on admission policy and application procedures.

High school seniors considering enrollment at OSU/ATI are encouraged to take the American College Test (ACT) or the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) and to release the results to Ohio State. Students are welcome to apply for admission even before taking their test since the results are generally not required for an admission decision. The scores are required for English and math placement and are also considered in the awarding of campus-based financial aid.

If you have already graduated from high school, please contact the OSU/ATI Admissions Office to see if ACT or SAT scores are needed in your case. Undergraduate transfer students do not have to submit standardized test scores.

The following high school preparation is recommended but NOT required: Two units of science; three units of mathematics; four units of English; and two units of social studies. Vocational agriculture or horticulture courses may be helpful as well.

### Admissions Deadlines:

Autumn Quarter August 15

Winter Quarter December 1

Spring Quarter March 1

Summer Quarter June 1

Financial Aid PRIORITY deadline for all quarters is June 1.

## HOUSING

A university Residence Hall housing 185 students is located on the OSU/ATI campus. Students may also contact the Admissions Office for assistance in obtaining housing elsewhere in the community. Refer to the OSU/ATI Residence Hall sheet for more detailed information about on-campus housing.

## STUDENT ACTIVITIES

An active program of intramural and intercollegiate sports, special events, and entertainment is coordinated by the Student Activities Office.
