Bassam Haddad is director of the Middle East Studies program and teaches public and international affairs at George Mason University. He is also a visiting professor at Georgetown University.

Haddad serves as founding editor of *Arab Studies Journal*, a peer-reviewed research publication. He is co-producer/director of the award-winning documentary film, *About Baghdad*, and director of a critically acclaimed film series on *Arabs and Terrorism*, based on extensive field research and interviews.

He is author of *The Political Economy of Regime Security: State-Business Networks in Syria* (Stanford University Press, 2011). Haddad recently directed a film on Arab/Muslim immigrants in Europe, titled *The "Other" Threat*. He also serves on the editorial committee of *Middle East Report* and is co-founder of *Jadaliyya Ezine*.

Haddad received his BA from George Mason University and his MA and PhD from Georgetown University, where he was also a visiting professor.
