Zhu Feng is professor of international studies and deputy director of the Center for International and Strategic Studies at Peking University. He is also senior research fellow at the China Institute of Peace and Development and the Center for Contemporary World Affairs. He writes extensively on regional security in East Asia, the North Korean nuclear issue, U.S. national security strategy, and China-U.S. relations.

He is author of *International Relations Theory and East Asian Security* (People's University Press, 2007) and *Ballistic Missile Defense and International Security* (Shanghai People's Press, 2001). In addition, he is co-editor of *China's Ascent: Power, Security, and the Future of International Politics* (Cornell University Press, 2008) and *The Past, Present and Future of China-Japan Military-to-Military Exchange and Cooperation* (Aiji Press, 2011).

Zhu is a member of the Beijing Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference and the International Studies Association Committee of Academic Freedom.

Zhu received his PhD from Peking University in 1991.
