RARE BIRDS AT LAKE SAINT MARYS, OHIO.<sup>1</sup> A number of birds rarely seen in Ohio have been observed at the State Fish Farm at Saint Marys, Ohio, by the author. On July 31, 1966, three Willets, *Catoptrophorus semipalmatus*, were seen. Buff-breasted Sandpipers, *Tryngites subruficollis*, were sighted twice by two different observers, four on August 27, and one on September 5, 1966. As many as four Wilson's Phalaropes, *Steganopus tricolor*, were observed on a number of occasions, both at the fish farm and at Montezuma Bay, from August 14 through September 11, 1966. A Northern Phalarope, *Lobipes lobatus*, was seen on August 25, 1966.

A Peregrine Falcon, *Falco peregrinus*, was sighted first on September 25, 1966, at the Mercer County Waterfowl Refuge, on the south shore of the lake. Further sightings occurred at the fish farm on October 13, 14, 15, and 16, 1966. Once it was observed attacking a Ruddy Duck, *Oxyura jamaicensis*, that was resting on a fish hatchery pond.—JAMES P.
