### MATTA CONTINUES TO BUILD IMPRESSIVE OHIO STATE RESUME

Thad Matta has accomplished a remarkable list of accomplishments in nine years as head coach of the Buckeyes and the 2012-13 season was no different. Matta's teams have never failed to win 20 games, a record streak (nine seasons) in Ohio State history. In fact, Matta has never failed to reach the 20-win plateau in 13 years as a head coach. The Buckeyes finished 29-8 in 2012-13, advancing to the 2013 NCAA Elite Eight in Los Angeles. Ohio State has reached 30 or more wins three times, all with Matta at the helm. Back-to-back seasons with 30 wins in 2010-11 (34) and 2011-12 (31) only trail the 35 wins recorded in 2006-07, the Ohio State record for single-season victories. In addition, Matta has won five Big Ten regular-season titles, including three of the last four (2010-12), four Big Ten postseason tournament crowns in seven title game opportunities, seven NCAA tournament appearances, including four-consecutive runs to the "Sweet 16," a pair of Final Four trips (2007, 2011) and a title game appearance in 2007. Throw in a National Invitation Tournament title in 2009 and Matta has guided the Buckeyes to postseason play in eight-consecutive attempts and in every year in which Ohio State was eligible.

### CRAFT, SMITH JR., BUILDING ON RECORD-SETTING PACE

The Ohio State senior class of Aaron Craft and Lenzelle Smith Jr. have recorded 94 victories entering their senior season. The duo were part of a team that won 34 games during their rookie campaign in 2011. Their sophomore season concluded with 31 wins and a trip to the 2012 Final Four in New Orleans. As juniors the pair led the Buckeyes to 29 wins and a trip to the Elite Eight in Los Angeles. Ohio State has averaged just over 31 wins a season the last three years. If the two reach that average as seniors, they would become the winningest four-year senior class in Ohio State history. David Lighty, who graduated in 2011, recorded 129 career wins in just over four seasons of competition. He played in seven games, all wins, during his junior season before breaking a bone in his right foot, ending his season. He was awarded an additional season of eligibility and won 63 more games as a Buckeye following his recovery from injury.

### PULUS PROMOTED, DIEBLER HIRED

After spending two seasons as the Ohio State video coordinator, Greg Paulus was elevated to assistant coach last July. The position was available after Chris Jent, who spent two seasons as an assistant on Thad Matta's coaching staff, left the program to become an assistant coach for the Sacramento Kings in the National Basketball Association. Matta filled the video coordinator vacancy with Jake Diebler, a former assistant coach and student-athlete at Valparaiso. Jake is the older brother of Jon Diebler, who played for the Buckeyes from 2009-11.

### DELLA VALLE ENJOYS PRODUCTIVE SUMMER

Amedeo Della Valle spent the summer after his freshman campaign with the Buckeyes playing for the Italian 20 and under national team in Tallinn, Estonia. Della Valle earned MVP honors in leading his countrymen to a 67-60 win over Latvia in the championship game of the event. Della Valle averaged 13 points, nearly four rebounds and 1.4 steals during the tournament.

### VETERANS MAKE UP 2013-14 ROSTER

When Ohio State takes the floor in the season opener vs. Morgan State Nov. 9, Thad Matta will have a veteran roster to choose from when selecting the starting lineup. Seniors Aaron Craft and Lenzelle Smith Jr. lead a team with nine upperclassmen (2 Srs., 7 Jrs.). Four starters return from Ohio State's 29-8 squad from a season ago. That team was a game way from

winning its fourth consecutive Big Ten regular season title and back to back Final Four appearances. Craft, already Ohio State's career leader in steals (248), is on track to take over the top spot in career assists as well. He also needs just 28 points to reach 1,000 for his career. Smith has started each of the last 76 games for Ohio State and has 96 games of playing experience as a Buckeye. Juniors Sam Thompson, Shannon Scott, LaQuinton Ross, Amir Williams and Trey McDonald also look to expand their roles this season.

### CRAFT WORKING ON HISTORIC CAREER

In the near future, senior Aaron Craft will become the first Buckeye in history to record 500 assists, 200 steals and 1,000 career points. He also could reach 500 career rebounds as well. Craft already is the Ohio State career record holder in steals with 248, only the second Buckeye with 200 or more. He became the third Buckeye in history to reach 500 career helpers with eight assists vs. Nebraska March 15, 2013. He has a career total of 530 after handing out 172 as a junior. With 28 points, Craft will become Ohio State's 49th Buckeye to reach 1,000 career points. Over 113 career games, he has averaged 3.2 rebounds a contest for a career total of 365.

### CRAFT MOVING UP BIG TEN STEALS CHART

Aaron Craft is in the Top 7 spot in all-time steals in Big Ten history. Craft has 248 for his career, already the Ohio State record and currently behind Brian Cardinal of Purdue (1997-2000) at No. 6 with 259.

### OHIO STATE RETURNS 4 STARTERS

The Buckeyes return four starters from a season ago in which Ohio State won 29 games for the fourth-consecutive season. Seniors Aaron Craft and Lenzelle Smith, Jr., along with juniors Amir Williams and Sam Thompson started as a group for the final 26 games of the 2012-13 season. Craft, Smith Jr., and Thompson each started 37 games a year ago with Williams starting the final 26 contests. Ohio State returns 65 percent of its offense (1,683 of 2,597 pts.), 71 percent of its rebounds (932 of 1,306), 88 percent of assists (433 of 493), 77 percent of blocks (124 of 162) and 87 percent of steals (216 of 248).

### ROOKIES LOOK TO MAKE IMPACT

Freshmen Marc Loving, Ohio's high school player of the year in 2013 and first team all-state, along with Kameron Williams, a Maryland native and 2,000 point scorer for Mount St. Joseph High School in Baltimore, will look to make contributions this season. Loving, a Toledo, Ohio, native, is one of six Associated Press Ohio boys basketball players of the year coached by Thad Matta. The six players have won the award eight times with Loving (2012, 2013) and Jared Sullinger (2009, 2010) claiming the honor twice each.

# HEAD COACH **THAD MATTA**

(2005-PRESENT)

Over the last four years, Matta's teams advanced to a second appearance in the Final Four (2012) during his tenure, have made an unmatched four-consecutive appearances in the NCAA tournament "Sweet 16," own three Big Ten regular-season crowns and have appeared in all four Big Ten tournament title games during that stretch.

In nine seasons at Ohio State, Matta teams have appeared in seven NCAA tournaments, including each of the last five. The Buckeyes own five Big Ten regular-season titles, seven Big Ten tournament title game appearances, with four championships. Ohio State teams have played for the tournament title in each of the last five years, a league record.

After posting a record of 29-8 in 2012-13, Matta's Ohio State teams have compiled a record of 250-73, a win total which is the most of any Big Ten coach over the last nine years. Matta's record in regular-season conference play (111-45) also tops all league coaches.

Several records and outstanding achievements highlighted Matta's ninth season in Columbus last year but success has been the norm for Ohio State since Matta took over the program in 2004-05.

The Buckeyes, with seven undeclassmen -- one freshman and six sophomores -- on the 2012-13 roster, closed the season with five wins to finish second in the final Big Ten standings. The Buckeyes then advanced to the 2013 Big Ten Tournament title game for the fifth-consecutive year and for the seventh time in Matta's nine-year tenure in Columbus.

Armed with the No. 2 seed in the 2013 NCAA Tournament West Region, the Buckeyes won three games, ending the season in Los Angeles in the NCAA Elite Eight. The many accomplishments were reached with just one senior on the roster.

Matta has done what he is used to doing as a head coach during the first nine years in Columbus - win. The 13th head coach in Ohio State history guided his first edition of Buckeye basketball to a 20-12 campaign in 2004-05 and followed that effort with a 26-6 record and an outright Big Ten regular-season championship in 2006. The 2007 season was even better with both an outright Big Ten regular-season title and the league tournament crown as well. Ohio State advanced to the NCAA title game and finished the season with a school-record 35 wins against just four losses. The 2007-08 campaign ended with a streak of five-consecutive victories and the 2008 National Invitation Tournament Title, won over three days at New York's Madison Square Garden.

His success continued in 2008-09 with a 22-11 record, an appearance in the 2009 Big Ten Tournament title game and a trip to the 2009 NCAA Tournament. The 2009-10 season followed suit with a stellar 29-8 overall record, a share of the 2010 Big Ten regular-season title and a Big Ten tournament championship win over Minnesota.

The Buckeyes recorded 34 wins in 2010-11, the second-most in school history after starting the season 24-0. Ohio State claimed both the regular-season and postseason Big Ten titles and entered the NCAA tournament as the overall No. 1 seed.

In 13 years as a collegiate head coach, Matta has produced 20 or more victories each year which includes three years at Xavier (78-23) and one at Butler (24-8). His average record as a head coach after eight seasons (221-65) in Columbus is 28-8.

As a Buckeye, Matta has more wins than any previous Ohio State head coach after nine seasons on the job with a 250-73 record to date. Fred Taylor was 161-65 during his first nine seasons (1959-67) for a winning percentage of .712 over that span. Matta's nine-year win percentage of .774 also leads the six previous Ohio State coaches who spent at least eight years on the OSU sidelines. The 123 wins over the last four years is the most of any previous Ohio State coach over a four-year span. Taylor's run from 1960-63 is second (98-9). Three of those Taylor teams (1960-62) advanced to the NCAA title game.

Matta is one of just two coaches nationally to post 20 or more wins in each of his first 13 seasons as a head coach. The 2006, 2007 and 2010 Big Ten Conference and 2006 USBWA District V Coach of the Year, Matta tied an Ohio State record for wins by a rookie coach (20) in 2004-05. Gary Williams, the former head coach at Maryland, posted a 20-13 record in 1986-87 with the Buckeyes. Matta (2005 and '06) and Williams (1987 and '88) are the only two Ohio State coaches to record 20 or more wins in each of their first two seasons in Columbus and Matta is the only Buckeye mentor with nine 20-win campaigns at the start of his tenure.
