Gibson to Lead FAES Library

From Vice Provost and Director of Libraries Carol Diedrichs:

Beginning January 2, 2014, **Craig Gibson** will be serving as Interim Head of the Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (FAES) Library. **Florian Diekmann**, the current head of FAES, is scheduled for an extended research leave beginning December 15, 2013, and Craig will serve in the interim role during Florian's absence.

We have been working closely with the College of Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (CFAES) on renovating the FAES Library and Student Success Center. Craig has been very involved with the project, including the initial feasibility study. That study focused on the needs of the constituencies for library services as well as the expanded scope of services to be offered by the College. Craig's input on the transformation of the FAES Library and his continued work there will ensure library services match the needs of our constituents. In this role, Craig will maintain a close working relationship with CFAES, monitor progress on the renovation, and advise Interim Associate Director for Research and Education Lisa Carter on critical decision points.

Craig will supervise the staff and student employees, sustaining high quality embedded service without the physical space during the renovation project. Craig will also continue the strong collaborative partnership between the Libraries and teaching and research faculty in CFAES and the related units of the university.

Craig's work as interim will ensure that we continue our strategic and programmatic goals to provide responsive and innovative support to our CFAES partners.

The exhibition presents a history of the Irish Literary Renaissance through rare books, including first printings and signed editions, from the Irish Collection. Visitors are brought to the moment at the end of the 19th century and the beginning of the 20th when Irish writers burst boldly onto the international literary scene as they claimed their literary independence and national identity.
