The instructors are members of the regular faculty of the College of Law.

Students are not permitted to start their professional law course in the Summer Session. Those who wish to accelerate their graduation can do so by attending two summer sessions and the Autumn Quarter of the third regular school session. Law degrees are awarded at the December and June convocations.

ADMISSION

(a) *Enrollment for credit:*

(1) Students in good standing at The Ohio State University College of Law may register for the summer session and receive credit toward a degree. Students in the University who are not enrolled in the College of Law and who wish credit toward a degree in some other College at this University, must comply with the regular requirements for admission to the College of Law. These are in charge of the University Entrance Board.

(2) Transient Students: A student in good standing in any law school having entrance requirements of two or more years of pre-law work, and who expects to return to his former college, will be admitted as a transient student. His registration will terminate at the end of the Summer Quarter, and his credits will be transferred to his own institution. He will not be required to submit a full transcript of credits, but must present to the University Examiner a statement from his Dean or Registrar that he is in good standing and that his work will receive credit in his own college. If at the end of the Summer Quarter he wishes to remain in this University, he must then secure a complete transcript of credits and apply to the University Examiner for readmission.

(b) *Enrollment not for credit: Legal Institute*

Members of the Ohio Bar, if certified as such to the Dean of the College of Law by the Clerk of the Supreme Court of Ohio, will be permitted to enroll in certain designated courses without matriculation fee and with a reduced registration (tuition) fee. No credit toward a degree will be given for work in these courses. Subjects of particular interest to members of the Bar have been scheduled at an early hour so as to conflict as little as possible with professional engagements. The subjects selected for the summer of 1940 are Federal Jurisdiction and Procedure (first term) and Income Taxation (second term). Each course is scheduled at 7:30 daily.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION WITH ADVANCED STANDING

Students are not permitted to start their professional law course in the Summer Quarter. New students who have already completed three Quarters work at other law schools may be admitted as permanent students with advanced standing provided:

1. Their academic record is at least "C" average;
2. Their professional work has been completed in an approved college of law;
3. The curriculum in the College of Law requires three years;
4. The College of Law requires three years of pre-law training.

A complete transcript of the entire record (high school, pre-law, and law) should be forwarded to the University Examiner for evaluation.

FEEES

With the exception of persons enrolled in the Legal Institute, a registration fee of \$20.00 for residents of Ohio and \$45.00 for non-residents is charged for each term of the summer session. In addition a matriculation fee of \$15.00 is charged for first admission to the University.

Those enrolled in the Legal Institute courses are not required to pay a matriculation fee, but must pay a registration fee of \$10.00 for each term.
