OHIO BOARD OF REGENTS HERE ON WEDNESDAY - On Wednesday November 18, Bill Napier, vice chancellor of the Ohio Board of Regents, Bill Boyle, member of the Board of Regents, State Senator Robert Cupp and State Representative Richard Thompson will hold an open forum for OSU/LTC students, faculty and staff and members of the greater Lima community at 4:00 in the Auditorium. Those wishing to address the forum will be handed a card as they enter the Auditorium on which they may express their concerns. These will be handed to Mr. Boyle, the moderator, and he will call people to the floor. Each person will have three minutes to express their views. Everyone is also encouraged to put their thoughts in writing and to submit these to the Board of Regents they need our input to make a reasoned decision on the future of the campus. The meeting will end at 6:00 p.m.

SAXOPHONIST IN CONCERT THURSDAY - Talented Saxophonist, James Umble, will be heard on Thursday November 19 at noon in Reed Hall 160. Umble, Professor of Saxophone at Youngstown State University is currently completing his Doctorate in music at the University of Michigan.
