BEHIND THE BAMBOO CURTAIN- Dr. Duane Roller, OSU classics department, will speak on his recent trip to mainland China on Tuesday, January 11 at noon in RH 160. Dr. Roller was one of 70 scholars outside of China (and the only one from Ohio) invited to attend the First International Conference on Ancient World History at Nankai University in Tiajin. Dr. Roller chaired a session of the Conference and read a paper concerning his research on Herod the Great. The color and complexity of this vast land will come alive through Dr. Roller's slides and experiences.
