OSU IMPLEMENTS "WAIT LIST"

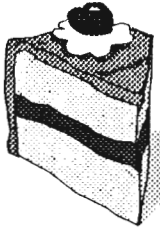
OSU has recently implemented a "WAITLIST".

If a student schedules a course for one quarter and gets closed out, he or she will be placed on a waiting list on the basis of first come, first served. The following quarter, those students on the waiting list will be given priority over a first time scheduler. Physically disabled or graduating seniors would still have priority status.
