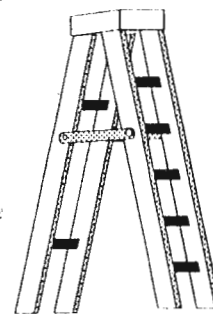
DISTINGUISHED TEACHERS CHOSEN

NEW PARKING STICKERS AVAILABLE

NEW CLASSROOMS NEW OFFICES

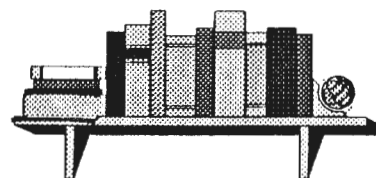


Workmen were busy over the summer preparing new classrooms and office space. There are four new classrooms in Galvin Hall; GA 056 and GA 060 are located in the basement, between the Student Activities Office and The Commons; GA 101 and GA 102 are located on the first floor off of the lobby. Renovations also enabled some faculty members from both schools to move into new offices on the second floor of Galvin Hall. OSU students will have the opportunity to use the new computer lab on the 2nd floor. --- Technical Education Laboratory renovations brought about two new laboratories for LTC; Law Enforcement and Dietetics. --- Cook Hall now houses the new LTC Emergency Medical Technologies laboratory. Faculty offices in Cook Hall also got a "facelift." --- Students interested in finding out where their classes are before the first day of school are welcome to do so. Rooms will be posted one week in advance of the first day of classes. LTC students need to check the official registrar's bulletin boards located in the lobby of each building. OSU students can check posted schedules which can be found in most stairwells and in lobbies of each building.

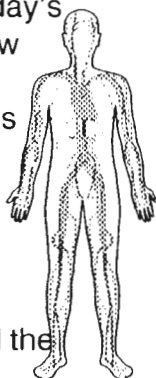

SERVICES OFFERED BY SECURITY OFFICE -

The Security Office is only a phone call away if you need help starting a dead battery. They also might be able to retrieve those keys you locked in your car. And they provide an escort service to your vehicle in the parking lot until 11:00 pm. Monday through Friday. Pick up any payphone and call 499, without charge.

ATM MACHINE IN PUBLIC SERVICES BLDG. -

For your convenience, there is a Bank One ATM machine in the lobby of the Public Services Building. It will accept MAC, MoneyStation, Plus, Cirrus, Visa, and Mastercard.

SAFEGUARD YOUR CREDIT CARDS -

Never lend your credit card to anyone. Never give your card number over the phone, unless you are certain the company or organization is highly reputable. Keep a record of your card number, expiration date, and the phone number and address of the card company in a safe place, separate from your wallet. Write or call the credit card issuer promptly if any questionable charges appear on your statement.

OUTDOOR PHONE IS AVAILABLE -

An outdoor payphone is on the walkway in front of the Public Services Building, between that building and Galvin Hall. You will save money if you use cash instead of a credit card or calling collect.

RIDESHARE EASY WAY TO COMMUTE -

Students can get more information on RIDESHARE, sponsored by the Lima -Allen County Regional Planning Commission, by just stopping in the Student Activities Office, GA066. Fill out an application and RIDESHARE will pair you with someone in your area who is going where you want to go. Save money and save gas!

Students with a current LTC or OSU ID card may use the gym facilities between 10-2pm Mon.-Fri.

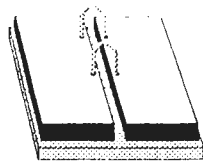
FLAG FOOTBALL OPTIONS OPEN-
