Information sessions, workshops, activities and entertainment will be offered Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, October 4, 5, and 6. On Tuesday MARY VERDI-FLETCHER and the members of the CLEVELAND BALLET present, "DANCING WHEELS", in the Auditorium from 12-1. A demonstration and explanation of CLOSED CAPTIONING ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY will begin at 1:00 in Ga 260. This technology uses stenographic skills to convey lecture material onto computers for the hearing impaired or the learning disabled. Angie O'Neill will give a demonstration and Mike Murphy of the Allen County MRDD will discuss the new technology. On Wednesday, October 5, businesses, social service agencies, and hospitals will have exhibits in the Atrium of the Public Services between 10-2.Challenge yourself to a game of checkers or take a stroll around Campus blindfolded! This activity begins at 11 in the PS Building DR. RICK CAPASSO from the Northwest Center for Human Resources, will speak on "ANXIETY, STRESS, AND OTHER DISORDERS", from 1-2 in GA 260. 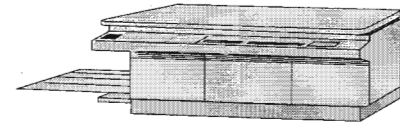
