OLYMPIC COACH HERE THURSDAY



Dr. Mary Jo Ruggieri, Head Coach of the Ohio State Synchronized Swim Team, will speak at noon on Thursday, March 2 in Reed Hall Room 160. In recognition of National Women's Month, Dr. Ruggieri has chosen as her topic, "Empowering Women Through Sports and the Mind-Body Connection." Mary Jo Ruggieri is in her 24th season at the helm of the synchronized swimming program. In 1970, she undertook the creation of the synchronized swimming program at Ohio State, which has become the winningest and most consistent collegiate program in the nation. Her years at Ohio State have been marked by extraordinary success, including 15 championship titles in the 17 year history of the collegiate national championships. Ruggieri has coached a total of 67 All-America selections and numerous U.S. National Team members including 1988 Olympic Silver Medalists Karen and Sarah Josephson. In that same Olympiad, Ruggieri was the head coach of the Venezuelan Olympic Team. In the summer of 1990, Ruggieri served as head coach of the U.S. National Team II. The Buckeye coach was also a member of the coaching staff for the 1987 U.S. National Team, and has coached several U.S. Olympic Festival teams. She also served as an Olympic coach in 1988 and 1992. In 1991, Ruggieri increased her international experience, serving as the coach for several Ohio State synchronized swimmers at the Pan American Games, as well as at the World Games in Bonn, Germany. In 1985, Ruggieri received the Lillian MacKellar Distinguished Service Award, recognizing her commitment to synchronized swimming and the development of the total athlete. Ruggieri has been published in various sports periodicals, and has written two books. Be sure to hear this dynamic speaker!
