OSU PROFESSORS RECEIVE AWARDS

Dr. David Adams, associate professor of Sociology and Dr. Mohamed Yousif, associate professor of Mathematics have been awarded one of the Ohio State University's most prestigious faculty awards, the Alumni Award for Distinguished Teaching. A total of ten such awards are given throughout the university system each year. "That two of the ten award recipients are from Lima is an indication of the high quality and great spirit of this campus," said Dr. E.Gordon Gee. Dr. Gee surprised the professors in their classrooms to present the awards. In a recent survey, OSU-Lima students indicated a 94% satisfaction rate with their faculty. The Alumni Award for Distinguished Teaching honors faculty members who have done a superior job of teaching. Recipients are nominated by students and colleagues, and chosen by a committee of alumni, students, and faculty. They receive a cash award of \$3000 and an increase of \$1200 in their base pay. The recipients will be inducted into the University's Academy of Teaching, which provides leadership on improving teaching at Ohio State. Congratulations!

EMPLOYNET BIGGEST JOB FAIR IN OHIO

If you are in the job market, the marketplace for jobs will be EMPLOYNET, the biggest job fair to be held in Ohio this year. Over 120 employers representing business, engineering, health and public/human services will be recruiting students for full time, part-time, summer, internship and co-op positions. EMPLOYNET will be held from 11:30-3 on Friday, April 7 in Savage Hall on the campus of the University of Toledo. The LTC Placement Office in conjunction with the other 18 member schools of the Employnet Consortium are sponsoring this event for their students. LTC students wishing to participate need to complete a one-page registration form at the LTC Career Placement Office (PS148) and provide them with a copy of their current resume. Students who are already in the Placement Office Data Base need only to complete the registration form. Registration must be completed by NOON, Thursday, April 6. Lists of the companies participating and the positions they are filling can be picked up in the Student Activities Office (GA066), Engineering/Business Tech Offices (TEL Lobby), the LTC Placement Office (PS 148), and various building lobbies around campus. 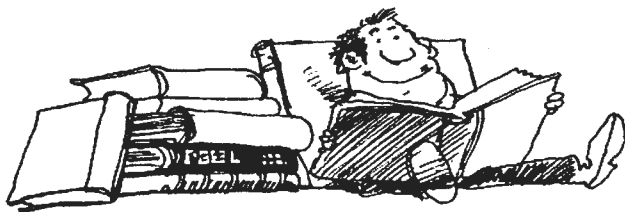

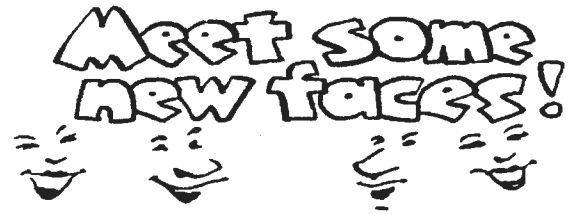
