## Ohio State Scholarship News

- ♦ The Auglaize Soil & Water Conservation District Auxiliary is offering one \$500 scholarship to any student enrolled in a college or university for fall 2006. 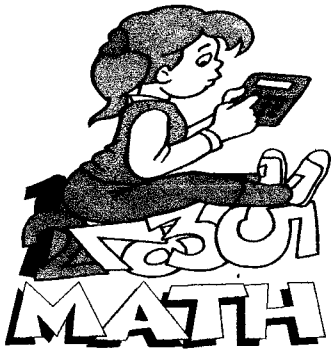

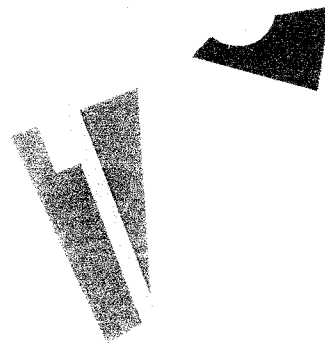
## **Dental Clinic**

Your house is not the only thing that needs a spring cleaning! Schedule an appointment to get your teeth cleaned at the Rhodes State College Dental Hygiene Clinic.

The clinic welcomes all students, faculty, and staff of the Lima Campus to make an appointment by calling 419-995-8346 or by stopping by the clinic in Cook Hall (next to the library). Community patients are also welcome.

Services provided include teeth cleaning, oral health instructions, oral cancer screening, diabetic screening, bitewing x-rays, fluoride treatment, tooth desensitization, and nutritional counseling.

Cleanings are FREE for students, faculty, and staff; however, a nominal fee is charged for panoramic and cmx x-rays. Dental hygiene students are supervised by licensed dental professionals.

## Performing Arts and Lecture Series

### **Robert Post, Post Comedy Theatre**

Martha W. Farmer Theatre  
for the Performing Arts  
April 10—12:30-1:30

Post will select from various works in his repertoire including: **SPIKED!**, an impossibly fast-paced work set entirely to a sound effects tape; **POST Child**, a duet with a puppet (created by Henson Studio artist Matthew Brooks) that looks like a third grade version of Post; **Pasquales Kitchen**, a wacky TV chef whips up a culinary feast of juggling, visual gags, dialects, jokes, magic and rhythm; **Beyond the Wall (A Mystery)**, a tour de force, six character, quick change murder mystery; **Ballet 101**, a hysterical parody of a ballet instructor; and **Tango**, a passionate dance with red long johns. All of the works are presented in a relaxed, improvisational performance style which breaks down the wall between performer and audience.

Post has performed for hundreds of thousands in almost every conceivable setting including university theaters, concert halls, street corners, dinner theaters, factories, schools, TV commercials, festivals, arenas, and with symphony orchestras. He has toured to forty-three states, and to Canada, Mexico and Japan. His PBS television special aired across the USA and Canada, winning the Central Education Network Award for Best Performance Program. Post has received numerous honors including fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts and the Ohio Arts Council and commission grants from the New York State Council on the Arts.

### **Helen Sung with Jeff Halsey**

Helen Sung initially pursued a classical music career (she began her musical studies at age 5 in piano and violin) by earning her Bachelor and Master of Music degrees in classical piano from the University of Texas at Austin. She first heard jazz music during that time. Her choice to switch to jazz was decided when in 1995 Helen was accepted into the inaugural class of the **Thelonious Monk Institute of Jazz Performance** at the **New England Conservatory of Music**.

Helen was a semifinalist in the 1999 Thelonious Monk Jazz Piano Competition. She has been profiled in *NewsDay*, and has had featured bills at venues and festivals such as the American Jazz Museum's "Blue Room", Philadelphia Museum of Art, Steinway Hall, Montclair Jazz, the Tusten Jazz Festival, Jeunesse's "24 Stundenkonzert" in Austria, and Shanghai's "Club JZ". In addition, Sung has performed or recorded with such jazz masters as **Slide Hampton, Benny Golson, Buster Williams**, and legendary composer and saxophonist **Wayne Shorter** and with such jazz notables as **Steve Wilson, Antonio Hart, and Lonnie Plaxico**. She has also performed with such big bands as the Charles Mingus Big Band, Clark Terry's "Young Titans of Jazz" Big Band, and Diva.

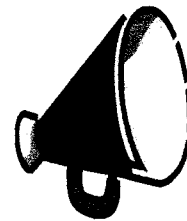
## Campus Activities Board
