The clinic welcomes all students, faculty, and staff of the Lima Campus to 8346 or by stopping by the clinic in Cook Hall (next to the library).

Services provided include teeth cleaning, oral health instructions, oral cancer screening, diabetic screening, bitewing x-rays, fluoride treatment, tooth desensitization, and nutritional counseling.

Cleanings are FREE for students, faculty, and staff; however, a nominal fee is charged for panoramic and cmx xrays. Community patients are also welcome.

Dental hygiene students are supervised by licensed dental professionals.




