We are especially interested in papers addressing legal and policy aspects of e-government and electronic democracy, cybersecurity, online privacy and public information policy, e-commerce, information technology and economic development, and telecommunications regulation. *I/S* envisions an eventual three-issue-per-year publishing cycle, including both hard-copy and subscription-based online versions.
