Changes to OSUL Website Copyright Information and Licensing: Faculty Action Needed

The old [terms of use](#) and [permissions request](#) pages have been retired and are replaced by the new [Copyright Information](#) page. The new page clarifies the roles and responsibilities of OSUL and library patrons in regards to the use of copyrighted materials appearing on the Libraries' website. The new page also provides information on the Creative Commons licensing of select OSUL web content.



Content on the Libraries' website for which OSUL owns the copyright (or has permission to sublicense) will be licensed under a [Creative Commons Attribution](#) (CC BY) license. The CC BY license enables others to share, reuse, and remix OSUL content so long as they credit The Ohio State University Libraries as the source of the original material and they indicate if changes have been made.

What does the license apply to?

The Creative Commons license will apply to materials for which the Libraries own the copyright (or has permission to sublicense). This includes:

- Content appearing on the Libraries' website that was created by faculty and staff as part of their employment with OSUL (e.g. LibGuides)
- Documents that may be linked to or hosted on the Libraries' document registry (e.g. handouts)
- Administrative, policy, and procedural documents accessible through the website

What is excluded from the license?

The Creative Commons license does NOT apply to materials for which the Libraries do not own the copyright (or do not have permission to sublicense). This includes:

- Third party materials (e.g. the Libraries' digital collections)
- Traditional scholarly works by OSUL faculty (**Note: Faculty must take action regarding materials for which they own the copyright; see below under "Action Needed"**)

The CC BY license also does NOT apply to:

- Photographs that contain easily identifiable images of faculty, staff, or students.

Why Creative Commons?

Applying an open license such as the CC BY license to OSUL web content helps to promote the following goals and outcomes:

- Increase overall use and dissemination of OSUL created materials
- Ensure that OSUL is credited as the source of the material
- Support Libre Open Access by removing at least some permissions barriers
- Promote OSUL as a leader within the profession by adopting a proactive, progressive approach to copyright management, and making materials available for reuse and adaptation by other libraries

- Reduce permissions requests by making OSUL created materials available for use under unambiguous terms

ACTION NEEDED: Faculty and non-employee students must take action regarding works for which they own the copyright. They may agree to participate in the CC BY license or they may clearly label materials for which they own the copyright with an alternate rights statement. They only need to complete the form once, but they are responsible on an ongoing basis to apply an alternate rights statement to any materials they do not wish to include in the CC BY license. NOTE: Visitors viewing OSUL webpages will likely presume that materials are included in the CC BY license if the materials are not labeled with an alternate rights statement or are not listed among the [excluded materials](#). ***Please see the instructions (including sample alternate rights statement) and [fill out the brief form on this page](#). ***

OPERS changes coming for rehired retirees

Employees of Ohio State who are retired through OPERS and eligible to participate in OPERS health care should pay special attention to OPERS communications regarding 2016 health care open enrollment. OPERS is making changes to how its retirees will receive health care benefits in 2016. For some OPERS retirees, the cost of their OPERS medical coverage may increase if they remain employed by an OPERS employer in 2016.

The OPERS health benefit changes are effective January 1, 2016, and retirees have to make their OPERS benefit selections by October 31, 2015. OPERS offers in-person and online seminars for retirees. For details and questions, please visit: opers.org or call 1-800-222-PERS (7377).

Executive Committee Meeting Minutes - September 1, 2015

Painting Restoration – Brent Lewis

There was a discussion about the paintings in the Geology Library and the presidential portraits in Thompson Library. Brent Lewis shared concerns about the inconsistent manner in which the paintings are protected (some have glass covering and some do not).

Brent has secured quotes from two vendors to add an appropriate and consistent thin glass cover to protect the paintings. The paintings in Geology are already in storage due to construction in Orton Hall. We will proceed with those first. The portraits in Thompson Library will be scheduled for summer 2016.

Next steps are to finalize quotes for the restoration of three slightly damaged paintings in the Geology Library; then move forward with the covering and restoration, as well as communication of the activity to the appropriate campus partners.

IFLA Debrief

Diedrichs updated the group on activities during IFLA in Cape Town, South Africa. There will be a blog posting with specific details about the conference later this month.

BPL Plan

Beginning this semester, BPL will have extended hours (until 11pm). Appropriate marketing will be undertaken to advertise BPL as an alternative to 18th Ave. and Thompson Library. This pilot will be reviewed at the end of fall semester to determine hours for spring.

Undergraduate Library Experience

Armstrong shared a draft proposal for a new undergraduate library experience and research prize. She will take feedback to the Teaching & Learning Committee and the program will be implemented on a pilot basis this year.

TDA

Diedrichs shared information about TDA@OhioState including information about faculty members that have been hired to assist with Translational Data Analytics. Alison Armstrong has been named to the TDA Faculty Advisory Board.

OhioLINK ILS

Diedrichs will participate in the OhioLINK directors meeting later this month where the OhioLINK RFI for the ILS will be discussed. Exec discussed the possible next steps in this process to inform discussion at the OhioLINK LAC meeting.

2016-2020 Capital Planning Cycle

New potential projects to explore further for inclusion on the list include:

- 3rd Module at the Book Depository.

- Renovating classrooms and office space on the lower level in the 18th Avenue Library.
- Renovation of staff and public space at University Archives.

No decisions have been made regarding these potential projects, but they will be included on the annual capital planning documents required by FOD as possibilities.

Exec approved filling a Developer (A&P) position in the IT Division.




Managing Students: Session Rescheduled



The Office Associate organizes and coordinates operations, procedures, and resources that facilitate collaboration, streamlining, and efficient customer service in Thompson Library Special Collections. Provides operational support services for the Thompson Library Special Collections Head, curators, staff, research fellows, and other patrons.

The Office Associate will be the first contact for incoming calls, invoices, e-requests, supply ordering, acquisition order submission, event support, equipment inventory and maintenance. Currently, these activities are scattered across the SC THO faculty and staff, leading to duplicative effort, confusion for patrons and library partners, and a significant lack of efficiency. This position will assume much of the current assistant curatorial staff redundant administrative responsibilities, allowing existing staff members to focus on access activities and better utilize their professional expertise. This position will reduce duplication of efforts and create a more consistent approach to our operational and fiscal functions. This position may require some evening and weekend hours. Please be aware that travel reimbursement and relocation assistance will not be offered with this position. This is a 1 year temporary appointment.


