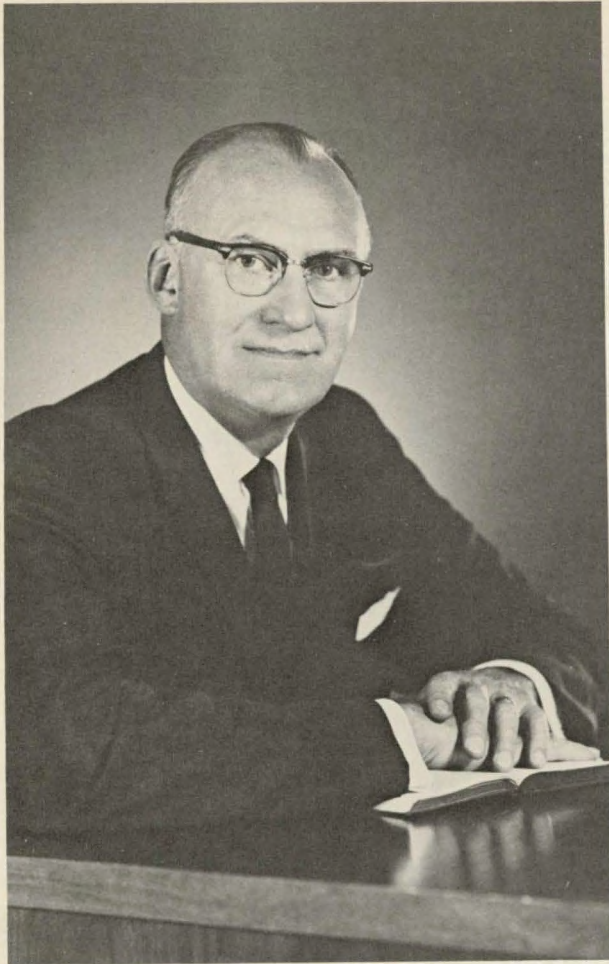

U of I Extension Program Helps Keep Iowans 'Tuned In'



One way to bridge the generation gap, assuming one exists, is to keep adults tuned to the same channels as the younger generation. One of these channels is education, and The University of Iowa has been taking the initiative by bringing itself to the adult working population of the state.

During the past decade, the U of I has kept more than 35,000 persons "in touch" through courses offered by its Division of Extension and University Services. The courses are offered by correspondence, in off-campus classrooms, and through independent study bringing the student to campus a few times per term.

At any given time, more than 2,500 persons are enrolled in courses of one type or another. Enrollment figures fluctuate daily as correspondence courses are completed or initiated.

The link with working adults, in both the public and private sector of the state's economy, is maintained in other ways through the division:

—The Bureau of Police Science, since its founding in 1945, has conducted over 100 short courses in police training and has helped law enforcing agencies with personnel selection, surveys, and publications. In cooperation with six area community colleges, the Bureau offers a two-year degree program in law enforcement which currently includes more than 200 students, most of them active police officers.

—The Institute of Public Affairs, established in 1949, serves as a research and training link be-

tween the U of I, public officials, and units of government on the local, county, and state levels in Iowa. As part of its educational program, the Institute holds conferences and short courses for public officials, including legislators, mayors, fiscal officers, and teachers. It aims through research to develop and publish information for citizens about important issues of public policy and to help officials to do their jobs more effectively.

—The Radio Broadcasting Services, through WSUI radio station, attempts to bring its listeners some of the cultural and intellectual life of the campus. Offerings include 98 hours per week of live broadcasts of concerts, recitals, convocations, classroom courses, lectures, and conferences. KSUI, the U of I's FM radio station, broadcasts stereo music Monday through Friday.

—The Audiovisual Center, established in 1914, provides more than 100,000 educational films to groups each academic year. The Center also serves the campus with audiovisual materials.

—The Iowa Center for Education in Politics encourages students to become active in politics. The program is planned in cooperation with leaders of the recognized political parties of the state and is offered in coordination with all four-year colleges and universities in Iowa.

—The Iowa Community Services program is a cooperative state-federal attempt to expand the continuing education services of colleges and universities toward solving community problems. A state advisory council assists in identifying the problems and also recommends actions which will assist in solving them.

—The Center for Conferences and Institutes helps plan and administer many University conferences, which complement the off-campus extension classes, independent and correspondence study courses.

—The Bureau of Educational Research and Service, founded in 1913, provides service, tests and scales to Iowa school administrators and teachers, public agencies and industrial concerns in Iowa and elsewhere. The Bureau also assists in significant research. For example, an experimental study on driver licensing currently being conducted will assist the State Department of Public Safety while indirectly serving all Iowans.

1921 - - - Stadium Moves To Completion . . .



Fifty years ago this fall, construction of Ohio Stadium was well under way. Actual work began in August, 1921, after more than 13,000 people pledged gifts totaling \$1,083,000.

The top photo shows work being done on the northwest corner of 'A' deck while the lower picture shows the stadium in later stages of construction, also in 1921. Note the railroad siding at the southeast corner, a necessity for delivering working materials.

A crowd of 71,385, largest in mid-west history at the time, saw the dedication game with Michigan, Oct. 21, 1922 after two earlier games were played with Ohio Wesleyan and Oberlin.

Last sections to be completed were in "C" deck at the north end of the stadium and work still was unfinished when the first two games were played.

The stadium now officially seats 81,475.



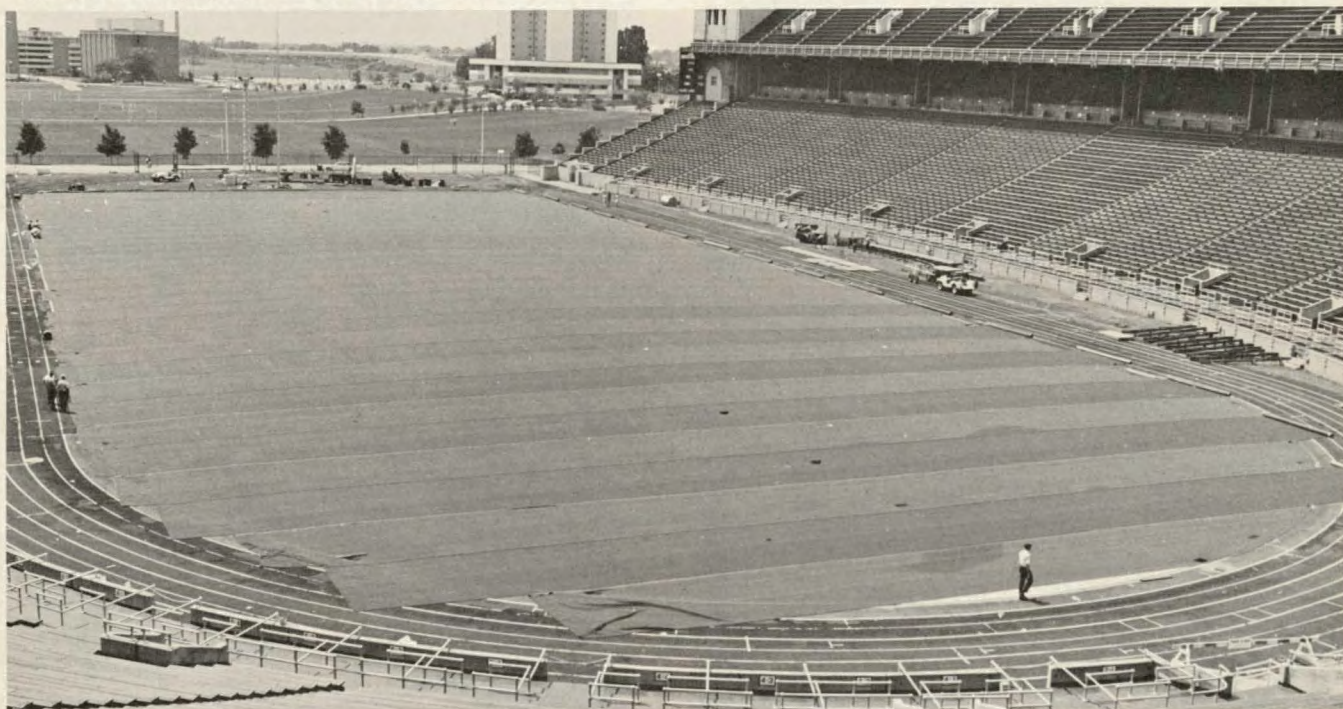
1971 - - - Artificial Turf Replaces Grass



Turf was removed from the stadium immediately after June commencement, the last scheduled event for the grass field. Grass had covered the playing area since October, 1922.



Early grading, an important and time-consuming stage, was next prior to filling in with rock and limestone.



Astroturf's largest college project is finished ahead of schedule. The 170,000 square foot job, including the practice field at North Facility, was ready at least 10 days before anticipated.



Near-finish of grading. A sealer was put on after grading had been completed, then asphalt in two layers of depth from three to five inches.



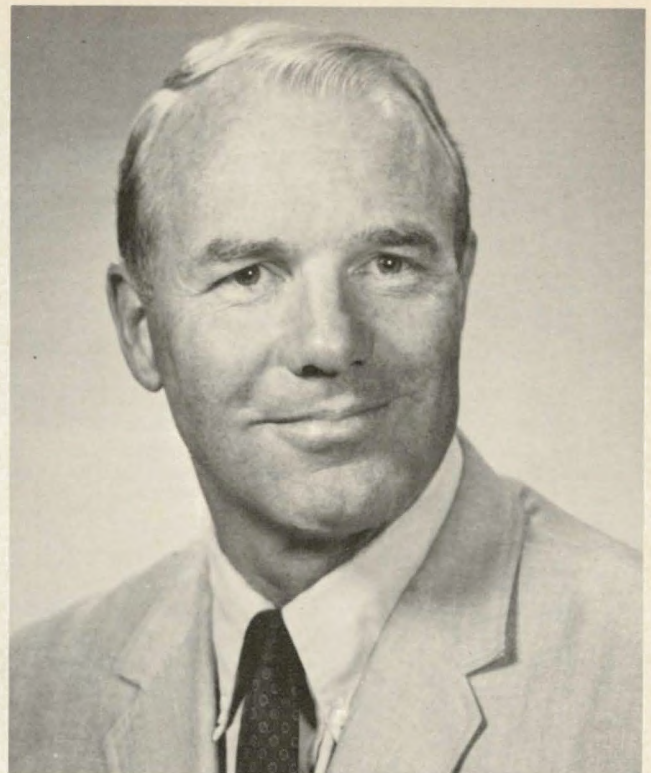
Astroturf is placed in five yard strips. A machine sprayed glue on the white foam rubber pad to which the turf is bonded. Rollers press the turf to the glued underpad. The crown of the field is 19 inches compared to the grass rise of 24 inches.

Football Friendship Helps University Obtain Astroturf



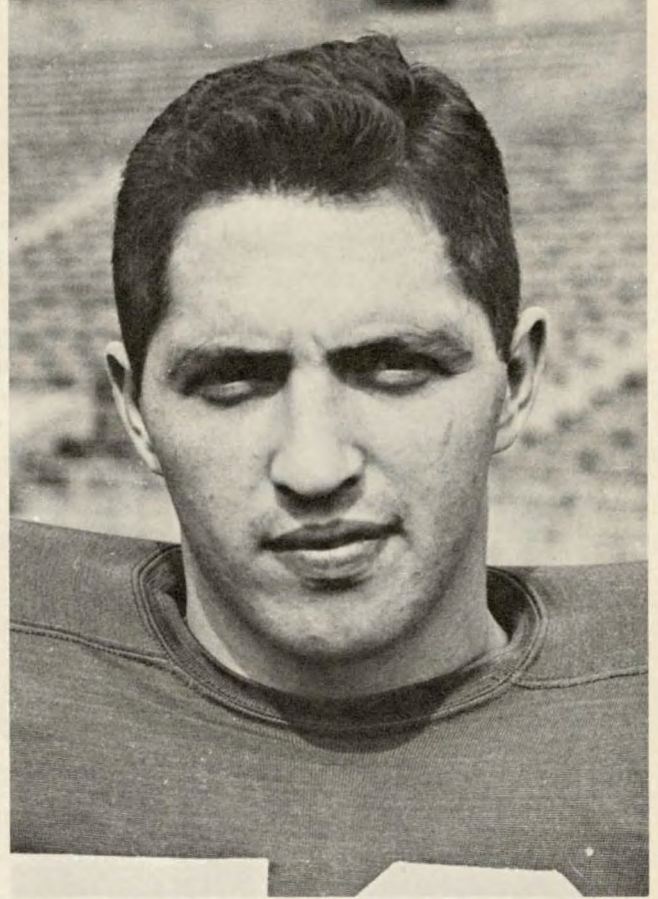
Louis C. Fischer, a guard on the Ohio State football squads of 1950 and '51.

Friendship established on the Ohio State football teams of more than 20 years ago has resulted in artificial turf for Ohio Stadium and the North Facility practice field.

Lou Fischer, who was a guard on the 1950 and '51 teams, decided some time ago that he wanted to honor the memory of Joe Campanella, his former team-mate and business associate. They had formed a partnership in a fast food business, turning a single Baltimore drive-in into a multi-million dollar enterprise.

Campanella, who came to Ohio State from Cleveland, died of a heart attack in 1968 at the age of 36. He and his wife, formerly Nan Hoover of Columbus, had seven children.

After playing tackle for three years with the

Buckeyes, Campanella was a five-year tackle for the Baltimore Colts.

A plaque recognizing Fischer's leadership gift of \$378,000 for the stadium and practice field will be placed on the southeast corner of the stadium. Gifts and athletic department revenue are completing payments on the project.

A luncheon was held this noon in the stadium scholarship dormitory to express appreciation to Mr. Fischer and his family and to some others who contributed to the turf fund. Mrs. Joseph Campanella and her family also were honored.

Fischer's third year of football competition was denied him due to a foot injury sustained in a swimming accident. He and his wife, formerly Babs Freeland of Columbus, have 10 children. A native of Charleston, W.Va., Fischer now resides with his family at Newton Square, Pa.

A MAN FOR ALL SEASONS

Being closely associated with athletics, Bill Reed was "A man for all seasons."

But even more than that, he was a man for all people—and that best typifies the kind of person he was.

Bill Reed, who died last May 20 at the age of 55, was the third commissioner of the Big Ten. He had suffered from arthritis the last 12 years and contracted hepatitis at the end.

Despite the pain he endured, Reed never lost that twinkle in his eye or that wonderful sense of humor. Although he eventually had to use a cane (and sometimes two) to get around, he always brought sunshine along when he walked into a room. It was something like receiving a visit from Santa Claus.

Bill had the wonderful facility of being able to get along ("rap" as they now say) with all levels of people, whether in the company of Washington bigwigs, university and athletic officials, sports writers, or the man in the street. He listened, and then could break down explanations of complicated problems into the simplest of terms.

Reed played football at Ann Arbor High School and as a freshman at the University of Michigan. Giving a hint of things to come, Bill majored in political science and served as sports editor of the university paper, *Michigan Daily*. While attending law school in 1937, he became assistant sports publicity director at Michigan and also worked as a correspondent for *The Chicago Tribune* and *Detroit Free Press*.

In 1939, Reed was hired to organize the Big Ten Service Bureau under Major John L. Griffith, the conference's first commissioner. Bill entered the Navy as an ensign in 1942 and served in both the Atlantic and Pacific in World War II. He returned to the Big Ten office in the fall of 1945 and in 1947 resigned to become an ad-

ministrative assistant to Sen. Homer Ferguson of Michigan.

While he long had debated a career in sports or public service, Reed finally forsook Washington to return to the Big Ten office as assistant commissioner in 1951. He succeeded Kenneth L. (Tug) Wilson as commissioner on July 1, 1961.

At each step along the way, Reed was highly respected by associates and he could rightly be called a "man's man." But it was the women in his life that really turned him on—his wife, Frances, and their three daughters, Mrs. Linda Moore, Mrs. Pat Rosen-trater, and Miss Rosemary Reed. When they were around him, he beamed.

Such was the case last September at the end of the Skywriters tour of the Big Ten, just one of Reed's innovations which has become standard procedure in all major conferences. Even though in pain, Reed had made a couple of stops and then joined a group at the end of the tour on a friend's patio

near O'Hare Airport. Fran and the three daughters joined the party and you could tell they idolized Reed as much as vice versa.

But a woman is more discerning than a man and there were more than smiles that day. My wife Marlene, who had worked in the Big Ten office when Reed was assistant commissioner, reported that on several occasions Bill had to bite his lip to beat back the pain.

As was his custom, Reed never complained. He listened to a lot of complaints from other people, but he never burdened anybody else with his vast burden.

If you read the third chapter of *Ecclesiastes* you will find: "For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven."

Bill's last season came far too early for such a great man and this football season just won't seem the same without him. He'll be sorely missed.

As a Matter of Fact...

(Some interesting facts about Ohio State, presented by the Alumni Association)

■ **Ohio State** has been playing football since 1890, and has been a member of the Big Ten since 1913. The Buckeyes have been Conference champs 15 times and have won the national football crown three times, and last season shared possession of the MacArthur Bowl with Texas.

■ **Ohio State** has gone to the Rose Bowl six times, more than any other Big Ten team, and has won four games (1950, 1955, 1958 and 1969) in Pasadena. They lost the first time in 1921.

■ **The Buckeyes** have played arch-rivals Michigan 67 times, more than they've played anyone else. The series stands at 25 wins for Ohio State and 38 for Michigan, with four ties. Twenty-one of Michigan's victories came before 1935.

■ **Ohio State's** official alumni organization, The Ohio State University Association, is the second largest dues-paying alumni association in the nation, and the largest such organization in the Big Ten, with some 50,000 members.

■ **Ohio Stadium**, built through private donations by some 13,000 alumni and friends, was completed in 1922—after only 13 months of work powered mostly by horses and steam engines. A series of Ralph Fanning watercolors depicting the stadium construction is on display in Alumni House in the Center for Tomorrow, on Olentangy River Road, just across the river and north of the stadium. Stop by after the game.

■ **The Ohio State** University was founded as The Ohio Agricultural and Mechanical College in 1870 as a land grant college. The

first class was composed of six men. Today the University has grown to well over 45,000 students in Columbus, one of the largest schools in the nation.

■ **Woody Hayes** has won more games and Big Ten titles (seven) than any other coach in the Conference since he came to Ohio State in 1951. At the beginning of the 1971 season, his record stood at 134 wins, 43 losses and seven ties.

■ **The Ohio State** Alumni Association coordinates an active alumni club program in many areas across the state and nation—probably with a chapter in your area. They'd like to get to know you.

■ **Ohio State** has had 52 All-Americans in 81 years of football, the first being Chic Harley and Bob Karch in 1916.

■ **Some 9,000** Alumni Association members have become life members, assuring them membership benefits indefinitely without annual dues payments. Easy quarterly payments can be arranged.

■ **Carroll C. Widdoes** has the best won-lost percentage of the 19 coaches who have held the head football post at Ohio State. In his two seasons at Ohio State, 1944 and 1945, Widdoes won 16 and lost 2 for an .889 average.

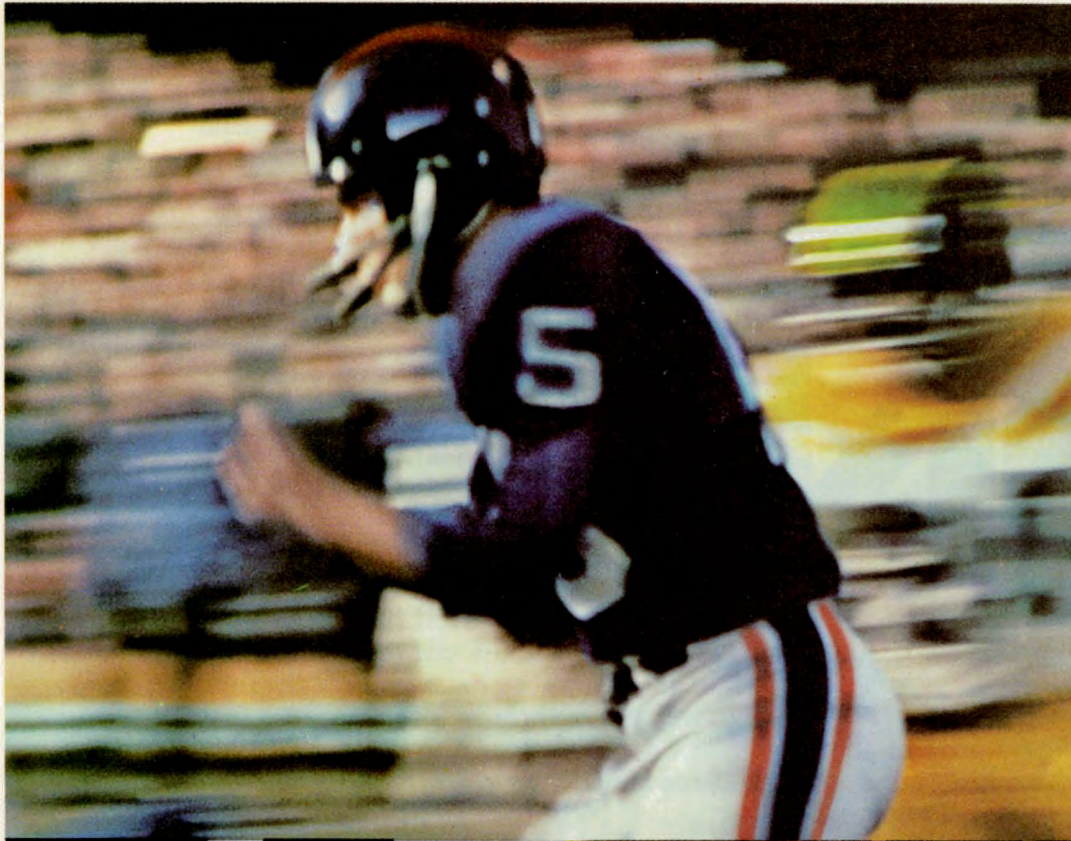
