NEW COUNTY RECORDS FOR OHIO LICHENS.1 Foliose and fruitcose lichens were collected by the author and Dr. Karl Mattox during the spring and summer of 1969. Those species coming from counties for which there was no previous record, based on the distributional maps published by J. Conan Taylor (1967, 1969), were noted and are presented here as new county records in Ohio.
