Submission of a manuscript is understood to mean that the work is original and unpublished, and is not being considered for publication elsewhere. All manuscripts considered for publication will be peer-reviewed. The opinions expressed by reviewers are their own, and do not represent the views of the Ohio Academy of Science or *THE OHIO JOURNAL OF SCIENCE*. Manuscripts and illustrations should be prepared in **triplicate** in accordance with current guidelines published in *THE JOURNAL* at least once a year, and submitted to:

Page Charges:
