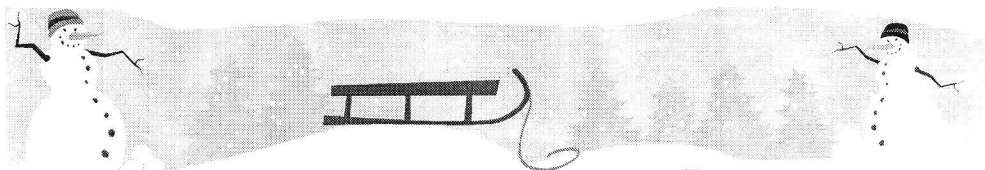

In a world of six billion people, it only takes one to change your life. Sixty-two-year-old Walter Vale is sleepwalking through his life. Having lost his passion for teaching and writing, he fills the void by unsuccessfully trying to learn to play classical piano. When his college sends him to Manhattan to attend a conference, Walter is surprised to find a young couple has taken up residence in his apartment. Victims of a real estate scam, Tarek, a Syrian man, and Zainab, his Senegalese girlfriend, have nowhere else to go. In the first of a series of tests of

the heart, Walter reluctantly allows the couple to stay with him. Touched by his kindness, Tarek, a talented musician, insists on teaching the aging academic to play the African drum. The instrument's exuberant rhythms revitalize Walter's faltering spirit and open his eyes to a vibrant world of local jazz clubs and Central Park drum circles. As the friendship between the two men deepens, the differences in culture, age and temperament fall away. After being stopped by police in the subway, Tarek is arrested as an undocumented citizen and held

for deportation. As his situation turns desperate, Walter finds himself compelled to help his new friend with a passion he thought he had long ago lost. When Tarek's beautiful mother Mouna arrives unexpectedly in search of her son, the professor's personal commitment develops into an unlikely romance. And it's through these new found connections with these virtual strangers that Walter is awakened to a new world and a new life.

Reed Hall 160** There are three Russian artists that American people have called their own in the 20th century: Tchaikovsky in music, Chekhov in drama and literature, and Stanislavsky in theatre. Since the 1930s, the

Stanislavsky System has been the leading training method of actors in the U.S. Stanislavsky's life, his artistic and pedagogical achievements have been described in many books. However, neither in Russian nor in English can one find a book about his artistic relations with actresses. Various female actors were at the core of Stanislavsky's System and his theatrical endeavors; they

dedicated their lives to theatre and to Stanislavsky's vision. Maria Ignatieva's 10 years of research have reached fruition in her book *Stanislavsky and Female Actors: Women in Stanislavsky's Life and Art*, published by the University Press of America in October 2008. Ignatieva will speak about her research and will sign books. The proceeds from the sales of the book will go towards the

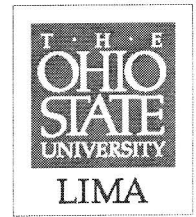
