Final Highlights of Enrollment for the Spring Quarter of 2004

April 19, 2004

Spring Quarter 2004 began on March 29, 2004. An official census for the quarter was conducted as of the close of processing on April 15th. The fifteenth day census is the basis for these highlights and the supporting data contained herein.

An overall increase in enrollment of 931 students compared to Spring Quarter 2003 was recorded for this quarter for a total of 54,618. All but two campuses experienced increases in enrollment; Columbus (up 549 to 48,130; 1.2%), Mansfield (up 169 to 1,443; 13.3%) Marion (up 128 to 1,403; 10.0%) and Newark (up 130 to 1,803; 7.8%). Lima decreased by 5 to 1,197; (-0.4) and Wooster was down 40 to 642; (-5.9%) . [Table 1]

Increases in Undergraduate, Graduate and Graduate Professional enrollment all contributed to the increase in total enrollment. Undergraduate enrollment increased 695 to 41,315; (1.7%), graduate enrollment increased by 115 to 10,119 (1.1%) while graduate professional enrollment increased by 121 to a record high of 3,184 (4.0%). Overall, two sources of undergraduate enrollment decreased; new first-quarter freshmen down 76 to 133; (-36.4%) and returning students (down 43 to 1,206; -3.4%). The remaining three sources increased; transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 up 32 to 285; (12.6%), transfer students above Rank 2 increased 10.6% (up 45 to 470) and continuing students (up 737 to 39,221; 1.9%). At the extended campuses as a whole, two undergraduate source categories recorded decreases while three had increases. Enrollment of new first quarter freshmen (down 5 to 84, -5.6%) and returning students (down 2 to 274, -0.7%) both decreased. Transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 11 to 52; 26.8%), transfer students above Rank 2, (up 10 to 104; 10.6%) and continuing students (up 376 to 5,644; 7.1%) all increased. Three of the sources of undergraduate enrollment at the Columbus campus increased: transfer students in Ranks 1 and 2 (up 21 to 233, 9.9%), transfer students above Rank 2 (up 35 to 366; 10.6%) and Continuing students increased 361 to 33,577; (1.1%). The two remaining sources decreased; new first-quarter freshmen (down 71 to 49, -59.2%) and returning students (down 41 to 932, -4.2%). The enrollment of graduate students at the Columbus campus for Spring 2004 was higher than Spring 2003, with an increase of 123 to 9,789 (1.3%). The enrollment of graduate students at all extended campuses was down 8 to 330; (-2.4%). Overall enrollment of new graduate students was up 72 to 397 (22.2%) and together with the increase in returning students (up 80 to 896 (9.8%) was able to offset the decrease in continuing graduate students (down 37 to 8,826; -0.4%). [Table 2].

Six undergraduate curricular academic programs at Columbus saw an increase in enrollment from Spring 2003 in excess of ten percent. They were Arts and Sciences, General (up 221 to 788; 39.0%), Education (up 116 to 714; 19.4%), Allied Medical Professions (up 141 to 907; 18.4%), Nursing (up 131 to 754; 21.0%), Pharmacy (up 90 to 261; 52.6%) and Social Work (up 68 to 209; 48.2%). One undergraduate curricular academic program at Columbus, Arts and Sciences, Unknown (down 86 to 75; -53.4%), saw a decrease in excess of ten percent in enrollment from Spring 2003. Graduate level programs recording changes (positive or negative) in excess of ten percent with the indicated number and percent change were: Journalism (down 5 to 32; -13.5%) and Human Ecology (down 13 to 99, -11.6%). The graduate professional program in Pharmacy recorded an increase of 13.2%, an increase of 54 to 462. [Table 3]

Credits generated by full-time undergraduates increased at Columbus (up 13,702 to 488,737; 2.9%) and for the extended campuses as a whole (up 5,885 to 69,485; 9.3%). The result was an overall increase of 19,587 to 558,222 (3.6%) from Spring Quarter 2003. Credits for part-time students decreased in total; down 2,644 to 43,675 (-5.7%). Credits generated by part-time undergraduates at Columbus decreased 7.9% (down 2,743 to 31,959) while the extended campuses increased 0.9% (up 99 to 11,716). The total credits generated by undergraduates for the entire university increased 16,943 to 601,897 (2.9%). As credit hours attempted at the undergraduate level for the university increased, credit per student increased slightly (up 0.17 to 14.57, 1.2%) compared to Spring 2003. At the graduate level, there was an overall increase in credits (up 2,407 to 110,425; 2.2%). The Columbus campus increased 2,738 to 108,024; (2.6%) and the extended campuses as a whole decreased 331 to 2,401; (-12.1%). Graduate credits per student for the university as a whole were up 1.1 percent with 10.91 credits per student. Graduate professional credits per student were down by -0.6 percent as total credits decreased 318 credits to 56,695. Undergraduate FTE increased from 38,997 to 40,126. Graduate professional FTE increased from 3,758 to 3,780. Graduate FTE increased from 7,201 to 7,362. [Table 4]

For the total university, the following counties recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent (positive or negative) from last Spring; Adams (down 30.0%), Carroll (up 28.6%) Meigs (up 63.2%), and Williams (up 22.2%). For the Columbus campus, the counties which recorded enrollment changes in excess of twenty percent were Adams (down 31.0%), Carroll (up 45.5%), Meigs (up 61.1%), Noble (up 31.3%), Preble (up 22.2%), Van Wert (up 33.3%), and Williams (up 23.7%). [Table 5 and Table 6]

For the total university, the states and territories with enrollment that changed in excess of twenty percent from last Spring were: Iowa (up 30.6%), Alabama (down 23.7%), Nebraska (up 23.8%), New Hampshire (down 26.7%), Alaska (up 21.1%) and Virgin Islands (up 50.0%). At Columbus, the states and territories with enrollment that increased or decreased in excess of twenty percent from last Spring were: Iowa (up 35.3%), Alabama (down 21.6%), Rhode Island (up 21.1%), New Hampshire (down 30.0%), Vermont (up 23.5%), Alaska (down 21.1%) and Virgin Islands (up 50.0%). Of the twenty-five countries with the largest representation of students enrolled at Ohio State, only United Arab Emirates (up 26.3%) recorded a change in enrollment in excess of twenty percent from last Spring Quarter. People's Republic of China, Republic of Korea, India, Indonesia, Taiwan, Japan, Canada and Turkey recorded enrollment of 100 or more students this quarter. [Table 9]

Continuing Education had an international enrollment of 11.1%, down from 11.6% last Spring. Other undergraduate curricular academic programs with international student enrollment in excess of five percent were Arts and Sciences, General (5.3%) Business (10.5%) and Engineering (8.4%). International student enrollment was 4,044 for the total university and 4,034 on the Columbus campus. Forty percent or more of the graduate students in Biological Sciences (48.5%), Mathematical and Physical Sciences (50.6%), Engineering (62.0%), Food, Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (45.6%), and Pharmacy (58.7%) were international students. The graduate program in Veterinary Medicine international enrollment of 45.2%. Total University enrollment of 45 International Graduate Professional students was a record high for Spring Quarter. [Table 10]

Spring Quarter record high enrollments among African Americans (3,590 at Columbus, 3,788 total), Asian or Pacific Islanders (2,519 at Columbus, 2,622 total) and Hispanics (1,007 at Columbus, 1,084 total) were reached this quarter. [Tables 11, 12, and 13]

At the undergraduate level, enrollment of Ohio residents increased (up 761 to 36,822; 2.1%) while enrollment of not-Ohio residents decreased (down 66 to 4,493; -1.4%). Graduate enrollment of Ohio residents increased (up 5 to 5,915; 0.1%) and not-Ohio residents increased (up 110 to 4,204; 2.7%). Graduate professional enrollment of Ohio residents increased 62 to 2,877 (up 2.2%) and not-Ohio residents increased 59 to 307 (up 23.8%). [Table 14]

Record high enrollment of 20,428 female undergraduate, 1,699 female Graduate Professional and 27,804 total female students was reached this Spring Quarter. [Table 15]
