

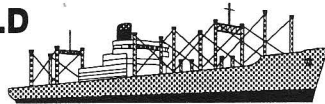

THE SEARCH FOR GOLD IS SPEAKER'S TOPIC



Adventure on the high seas --the search for gold -- Come with speaker **ROBERT EVANS** as he takes you aboard the research vessel Arctic Discoverer as he and his team search for the sunken steamship S.S. *Central America*. This exciting lecture/slide program will take place on Thursday, April 4 at noon in Reed Hall Room 160. Bob is the chief scientist and historian of the S.S. *Central America Project*. In 1983 the project's founder, Tom Thompson, enlisted Bob to compile the myriad historical accounts and documents relating to the sinking of the S.S. *Central America* and to conduct research concerning the physical environment in which the steamship sank. This research was instrumental in the successful search for the shipwreck conducted using side-scan sonar in the summer of 1986. In subsequent years Mr. Evans has served as the Science Officer of the Research Vessel Arctic Discoverer, the mother ship for the project's remotely-controlled submarine NEMO. His responsibilities include the planning and supervision of NEMO'S dives to the wrecksite, 1 1/2 miles below the ocean surface, about 200 miles southeast of Charleston, S.C. He coordinates the excavation objectives with the project engineers and technicians who design and operate the tools on NEMO to meet those objectives. When gold, artifacts and scientific specimens are recovered and brought to the surface, Evans is responsible for the cataloguing, conservation and study of those materials. Evans received his B.S. in Geology/Minerology from The Ohio State University.

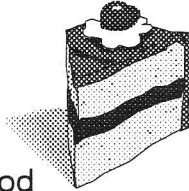

The golf and tennis teams are ready to go - if only the weather will cooperate!

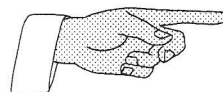

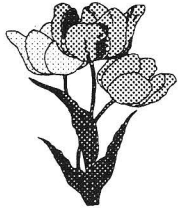
SUMMER JOBS AVAILABLE

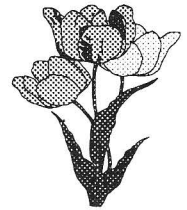
