We hope you will "get with it" early, which means making intelligent priorities, or putting first things first in planning your work-a-day program.

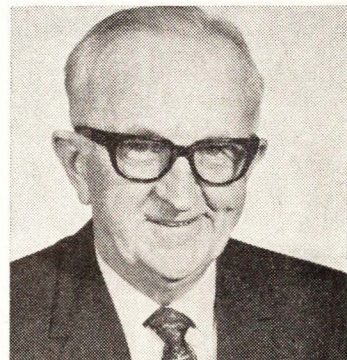

OSU Mother's Association Hosting Parents' Meetings

The OSU Mother's Association invites parents of either Columbus or Lima Campus students to attend initial fall quarter meetings later this month to become acquainted with the organization.

A social hour-tea will be hosted from 3-5 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 21, in the Phase II cafeteria. Invitations will be issued to all parents by the OSU Mothers while faculty will be invited by the University. No special program is planned, but parents and faculty will be encouraged to mix freely. Refreshments will be served and both Lima Campus buildings will be open for personal tours.

The second meeting will be from 8-9 p.m. Monday Sept. 29, in the Phase II auditorium. Purpose of the session will be to provide information about student life and academic expectations at OSU-Lima. Included in the program will be

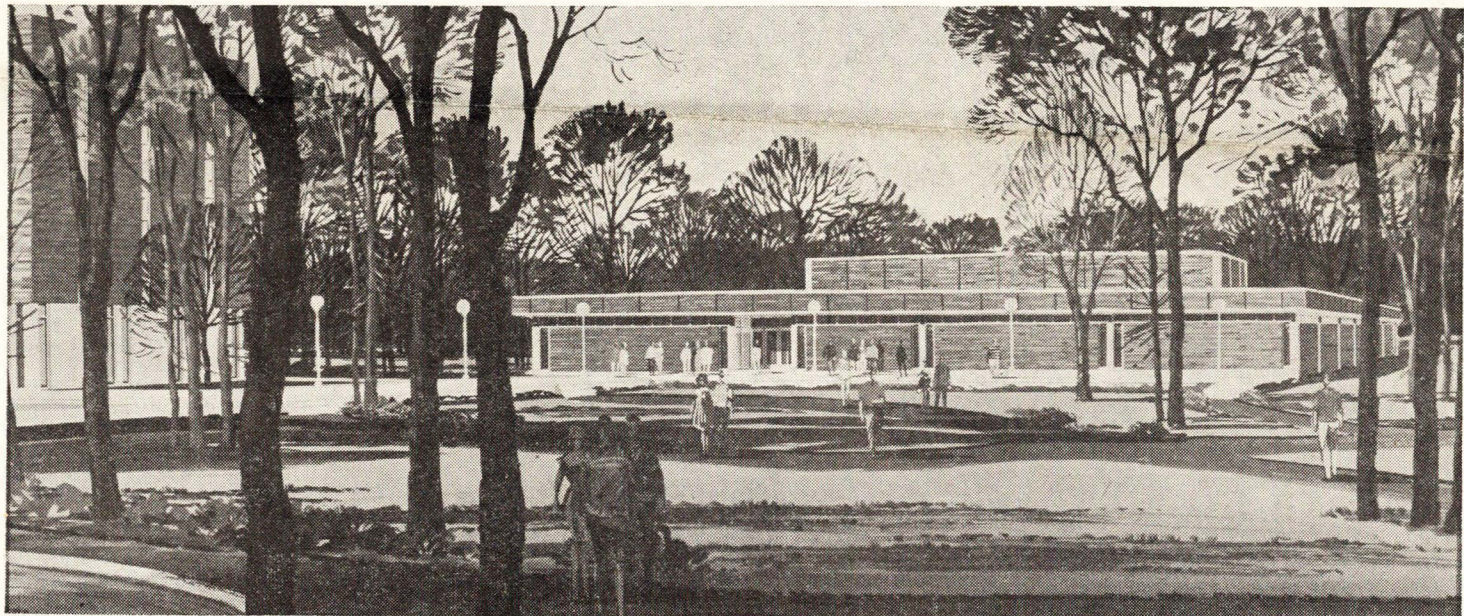

UVC 100 Helps Students Adjust To College

All incoming freshmen will be required to take UVC 100, a freshman survey course, which will be offered at noon

on Mondays and Wednesdays.

Purpose of the course, initiated last fall, is to orient students to the University and to develop sound study habits. Students will be separated into their respective college area groups and will be taught by full-time Campus faculty members. The course carries one hour credit.

Sports Programs Beginning Early

Competitive athletics, which are called extra-mural sports on the OSU Campuses will get an early start this year. Soccer is the first sport to swing into action with a match between Lima Campus and OSU-Newark at home on Saturday, Oct. 11, at 1:30 p.m. Other matches are scheduled with Bluffton College and OSU-Newark, with the possibility of two matches with the University of Dayton JV team.

If enough interest is shown, OSU-Lima could initiate a Cross Country team. Approximately ten to fifteen students would have to show an interest before a team could be started.

Other extramural sports on the OSU-Lima Campus are basketball, golf, and tennis.

Intramural touch-football will begin within the first two
