

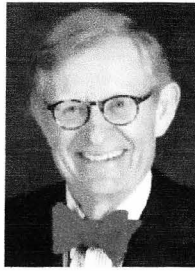

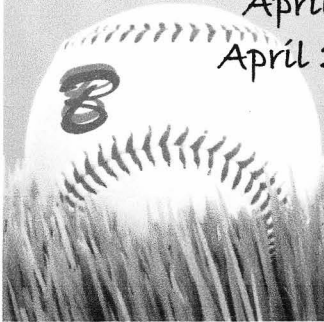

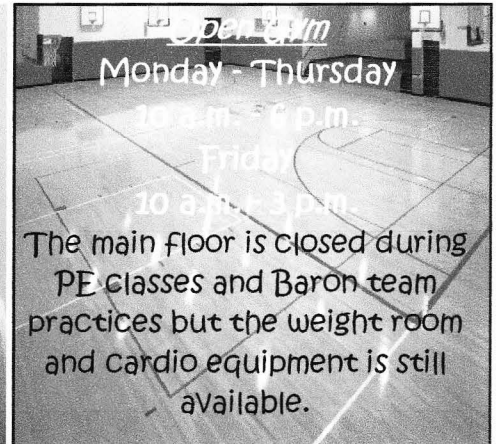

April Is National Organ Donation Month

Thousands of Americans are in need of vital organs and tissues. For many, the chance to live a full life won't come unless more of us consider organ, eye and tissue donation. Each one of us has the potential to save up to eight lives as an organ donor and touch another fifty as a tissue donor. To learn how to document your decision to become a donor, go today to www.donatelifeohio.org.

Despite continuing efforts at public education, misconceptions and inaccuracies about donation persist. Learn these facts to help you better understand organ, eye and tissue donation:



- *Anyone can be a potential donor regardless of age, race, or medical history.
- *All major religions in the United States support organ, eye and tissue donation and see it as the final act of love and generosity towards others.
- *If you are sick or injured and admitted to the hospital, the number one priority is to save your life. Organ, eye and tissue donation can only be considered after you are deceased.
- *When you are on the waiting list for an organ, what really counts is the severity of your illness, time spent waiting, blood type, and other important medical information, not your financial status or celebrity status.
- *An open casket funeral is possible for organ, eye and tissue donors. Through the entire donation process the body is treated with care, respect and dignity.
- *There is not cost to the donor or their family for organ or tissue donation.

Services provided include teeth cleaning, oral health instructions, oral cancer screening, diabetic screening, bitewing x-rays, fluoride treatment, tooth desensitization and nutritional counseling. Cleaning are FREE however a nominal fee is charged for panoramic and cmx x-rays. Dental hygiene students are supervised by licensed dental professionals.
