## A. IDENTIFICATION & LOCATION

### 1. Name

1.1 Building was never officially named by Board of Trustees.

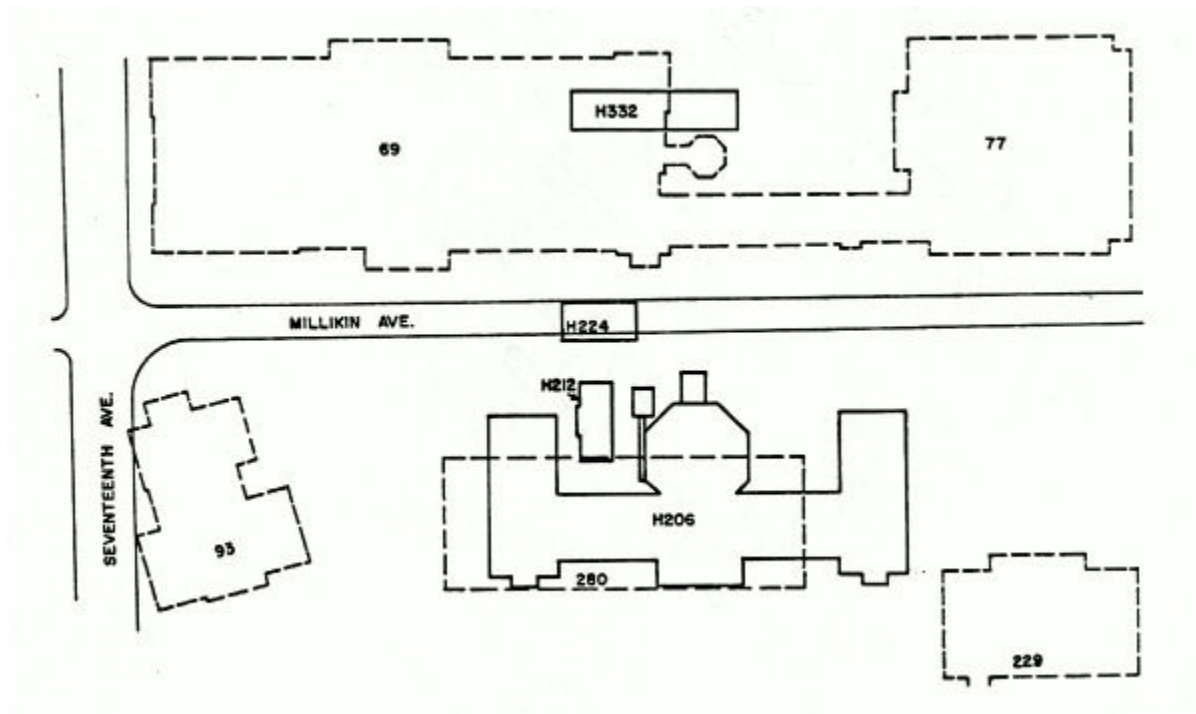

### 3. General Description (from drawings in archives)

3.1 Type of construction:

Brick exterior, frame roof structure, concrete floor.

3.2 No. of stories:

One

3.3 Increments of construction:

No additions

3.4 Size of building:

Consisted of eight box stalls, each 10' x 10' and each with direct access to outside.

dimensions approximately 22,6" x 44'.

## B. PLANNING & CONSTRUCTION

Built as part of the Veterinary Clinic (H 206). See report for H 206 for details.

## C. DEMOLITION

1. No record has been found.
2. The building appears in a 1929 photograph (X 1008); it does not appear in a 1939 picture (X 1012).
3. Dean Emeritus Walter Krill states that the building was demolished when the large animal isolation ward was moved to the north wing of the old Cattle Barn (H 205).
4. Associate Dean Vernon L. Tharp recalls that these wards were in H 205 when he came to OSU as a pre-veterinary student in 1935, and he has no recollection of H 224.
5. Professor Emeritus John Helwig also recalls that the large animal wards were in H 205 when he started as a student in Veterinary Medicine in 1933, and also has no recollection of H 224.
6. Cabinet on November 15, 1932 awarded contracts for remodeling H 205 for Veterinary Medicine and Poultry.  
No drawings or other contract documents have been found. The work was apparently done promptly, since McCracken reported to Cabinet on February 20, 1933 that he had received a letter of thanks from Dean Brumley for the work which had been done.
7. The foregoing evidence would suggest that H 224 was demolished in 1933, after completion of the work in the old Cattle Barn early in the year and before John Helwig came as a student in the Autumn Quarter.
