New Survey Course Unfolds College Life

Ohio State University has initiated a new required course for first quarter freshmen. The course, entitled Freshmen Survey 100, carries one hour credit and will supplement the present academic program.

In a recent meeting with Dean Richard Zimmerman, Lima Campus officials and faculty made final plans for the scope of the course. It will attempt to assist new students in adjusting to collegiate academic programs and college life. Dean Zimmerman emphasized that the primary intent of the course should be to reinforce learning in other courses while strengthening the student's understanding of how he can achieve his goals.

Classes will be arranged to include lectures by Columbus and local faculty members, with the first four classes scheduled in the Phase II building auditorium. The first class session will be Oct. 1.

Subsequent sessions, to concentrate on introducing the students to details of program planning, study skills and academic advisement, will be conducted in the student's area of interest by resident faculty members.

Speakers for the first four sessions will be Dr. Richard Zimmerman, dean of University College, Columbus; Mrs. Jean Sewell, Lima Campus librarian; Jon E. Rockhold, Lima OSU assistant director; Frank Hill, Lima OSU business manager; and Richard West, Lima OSU student activities coordinator.

Program supervisors will teach the remainder of the classes with students being divided into the particular areas of interest. Program supervisors
