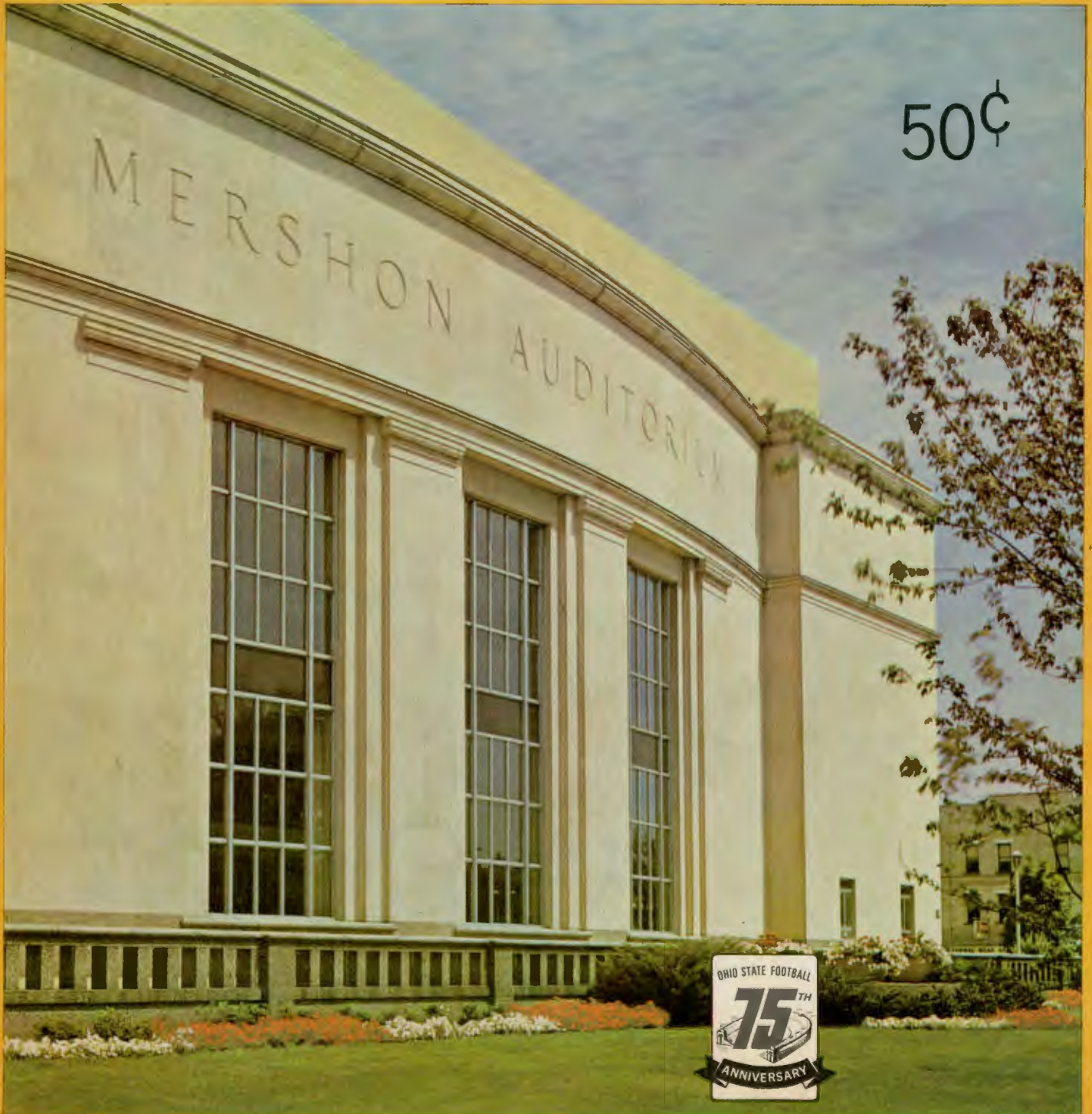

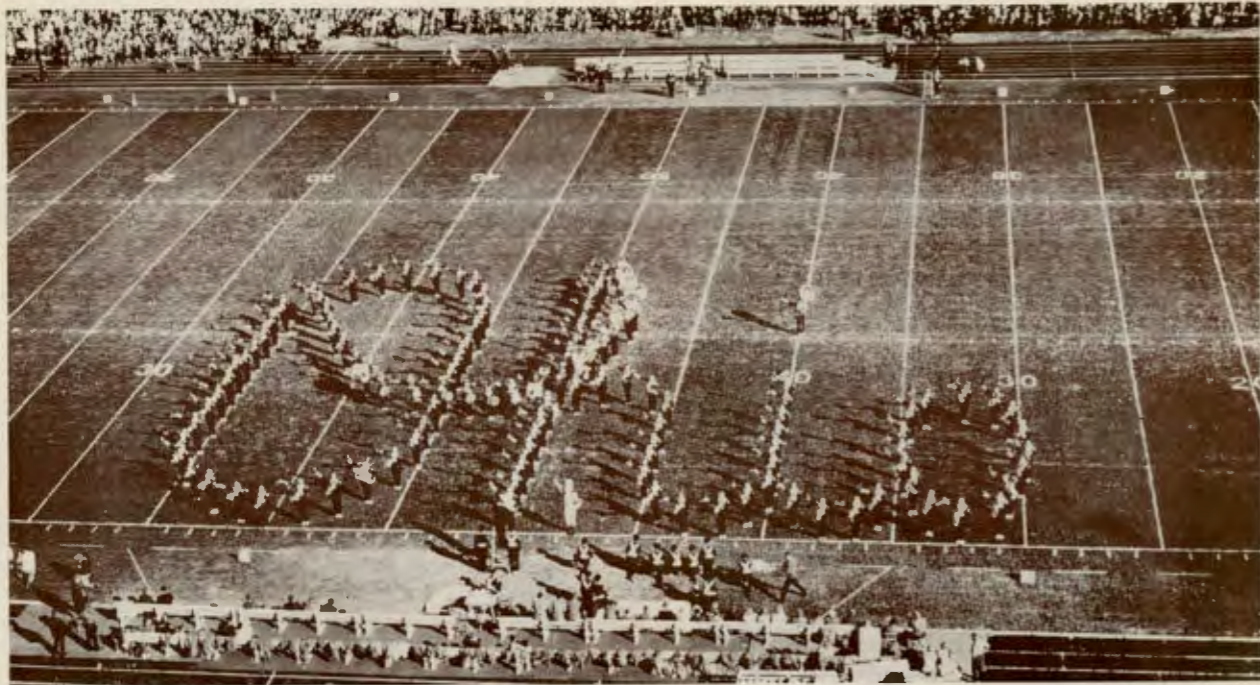

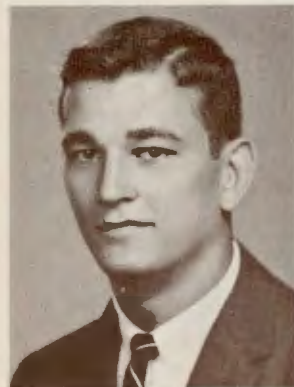

STARS AMONG THE WOLVERINES

WILLIAM L. KEATING, 6-2, 230, 19, junior. Bill is younger brother of Tom Keating, top Wolverine tackle past three years . . . didn't see any action last season but showed real promise in spring drill . . . big, hard-hitting, a solid player . . . born November 22, 1944 in Chicago.



BOB TIMBERLAKE
No. 28—Quarterback

ROBERT W. TIMBERLAKE, 6-4, 215, 21, a senior . . . Bob has been a standout back for two seasons. As a sophomore two years ago he played more than any other back, 325 minutes, as left half and quarterback . . . drafted to left half to fill gap, he did outstanding job. In 1962 he rushed 104 yards net on 74 tries, completed 16 of 34 passes for 179 yards and scored

14 points on a touchdown, a field goal, five conversion points and by rushing for two extra points after touchdown.

RICHARD P. HAHN, 6-0, 205, 20, senior. As a sophomore Hahn played 239 minutes to earn his letter . . . last year his playing time was 304 minutes . . . from Norton Village, Ohio, where he was an all-stater and also played in annual Ohio North-South all-star game. Rich was born at Wadsworth, Ohio, October 2, 1943.

BRIAN P. PATCHEN, 5-11, 215, 21, a junior . . . Lettered last year as he took over very capably for injured Tom Cecchini . . . played 269 minutes . . . from Steubenville, Ohio, where he captained Catholic Central under Coach John Baroni . . . all-Ohio Valley and eastern Ohio center . . . born in Steubenville, April 12, 1943.

WILLIAM G. LASKEY, 6-2, 217, 21, a senior. Bill was an outstanding halfback at Milan high school gaining all-conference and top all-state honors and All-American mention. A fine halfback prospect he was shifted to end two years ago and has made remarkable strides in the new position. Last year he played 257 minutes and 184 minutes as a sophomore . . . Bill was born in Ann Arbor, February 10, 1943.

CHARLES G. KINES, 6-0, 230, 20, a junior in Education, he's one of the group of Niles, Ohio, McKinley high school athletes on the Wolverine squad . . . coached by Tony Mason, present offensive line coach for Michigan . . . He was born in Warren, Ohio, May 30, 1944.

RICHARD M. RINDFUSS, 6-0, 192, 21, a senior from Niles, Ohio, Dick played more than any other Wolverine last year in earning his second letter—a total of 425 minutes in nine games. He played more

than 50 minutes in four contests, and against Ohio State he saw 57 minutes and 20 seconds of action, enough to qualify him as the workhorse of any squad. Two years ago he played 152 minutes, averaging about three yards on 20 plays, scoring one touchdown. In 1963 he lugged the ball 58 times for a net of 211 yards and a 3.64 yard average, scoring three touchdowns.

JAMES P. CONLEY, 6-3, 198, 21, senior and captain from Springdale, Pa. . . he played 228 minutes as a sophomore at Michigan. Last year he played almost 326 minutes, both offensively and defensively, catching six passes for 114 yards and one touchdown. A hard blocking, hard tackling clutch player. He was born in New Kensington, Pa., March 24, 1943.

MELVIN ANTHONY, 6-0, 210, 21, senior. Mel hails from Cincinnati, Ohio, where he played at Roger Bacon High. Mel scored 13 TD's in high school, nine of them as senior. As a junior he scored four touchdowns on dashes of 10 to 74 yards . . . Two years ago he played only 47 minutes with handicap of injured ankle . . . 27 of those minutes came against Ohio State . . . carried ball only 18 times for 2.67 yard average. Last year he played 270 minutes, scored five touchdowns . . . rushed 103 times for 394 yards net, averaging 3.82 yards per carry. He was born in Cincinnati, January 30, 1943.

JACK D. CLANCY, 6-1, 198, 20 junior . . . switched from quarter to halfback last year and became starting left half . . . strong runner with good speed . . . average 3.21 yards rushing and picked up 78 yards receiving passes one for a TD . . . Jack was born at Fort Dodge, Iowa, June 18, 1944.

WILLIAM YEARBY, 6-3, 222, 20, a junior . . . from Detroit Eastern high school . . . Transferred from end where his strong, aggressive play attracted attention of coaches . . . captained high school team, also lettered in track, basketball . . . played 258 minutes last season as soph . . . born July 24, 1944, Birmingham, Ala.

The University of Michigan

IN just two years, The University of Michigan will mark its 150th anniversary. From a modest beginning of only seven students, taught by two professors, it has grown to an enrollment of 29,103, taught by a faculty of more than 2,000.



In 1837, it was given 40 acres of land as a campus site. Now it occupies some 2,300 acres on two campuses in the City of Ann Arbor, has two other campuses elsewhere in the State of Michigan, and operates summer field camps in half a dozen other locations.

The University is composed of 17 schools and colleges. Subjects taught include: literature, chemistry, psychology, law, medicine, business administration, dentistry, engineering, nursing, public health, natural resources, social work, art and architecture, and economics.

It is such academic diversity that for many years has drawn students from other countries to the University. This year there are over 700 such students from 86 countries.

Michigan is both a teaching and research institution. Most of the faculty members and a very large portion of the students,

both graduate and undergraduate have some involvement with research projects. During the last academic year, the University spent approximately \$42 million on research. Most of this came from the United States government, with the National Institutes of Health providing the biggest amount. The remainder came from industry, foundations, and the state government.

Student life also is diverse. Over 7,500 of the students live in University dormitories, while others live at home, in private apartments, or in fraternities or sororities. There is a Student Government Council which represents the students to the University administration.

The students publish a daily morning newspaper that contains University, state and world news and which competes with the local city publications.

Included among the University's more specialized teaching activities is the English Language Institute to which come throughout the year, teachers and students from other lands to learn to teach English as a foreign language. It is activities such as this, together with the University's diversity and long history, that have caused the institution to have alumni throughout the world, many of whom still take an active interest in its progress.

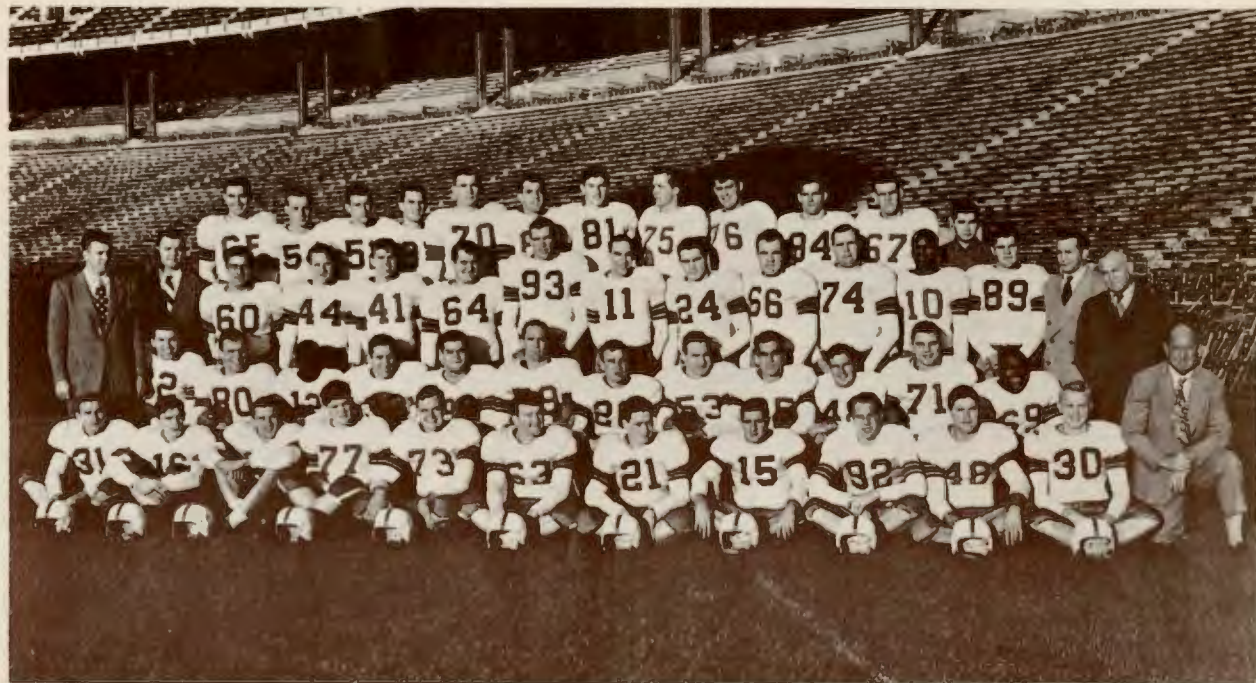

MEMBERS of the 1949 co-Big Ten champions and 1950 Rose Bowl winners are holding a reunion here this week-end to recall events which excited Buckeye football fans 15 years ago. Former Head Coach Wesley E. Fesler also is among those returning for the celebration.

This team had a season's record of seven wins, one loss and two ties before upsetting the University of California in the Rose Bowl 17 to 14. After a one-point victory, 35-34, over the University of Missouri, the Buckeyes thumped Indiana 46 to 7. A 13-13 tie followed against the University of Southern California. Injuries were numerous in the USC game and the Bucks lost to Minnesota 27 to 0 on the following Saturday.

A four-game winning streak followed, 21 to 0 over Wisconsin; 24-7 over Northwestern; 14-10 over Pittsburgh and 30-17 over Illinois.

A 7-7 tie at Ann Arbor gave the Buckeyes a share of the title with the Wolverines, Ohio State being eligible for the Rose Bowl because of Michigan's appearance there the year before.

Halfback Jerry Krall led the team in rushing with 606 yards, followed by Fullback "Curly" Morrison with 494. Quarterback Pandel Savic completed 35 passes in 84 attempts for 575 yards and six touchdowns.

Halfback Ray Hamilton led the team in pass receiving with 15, good for 357 yards and four touchdowns. Morrison led the team in rushing touchdowns with eight, followed by Krall with four.

Punting was divided between Pete Perini, Morrison and Vic Janowicz, with respective averages being 40.4; 38.1 and 34.8.

End Jimmy Hague, whose 17-yard field goal won the Rose Bowl game with one minute and five seconds to play, led the team in playing time with 336 minutes, followed by Center Jack Lininger with 307 and Guard John Biltz with 300.

California led at the half 7-0 after a scoreless first quarter, but Ohio State went ahead 14-7 midway in the third period. After the Bears tied the score at 14-14 late in the third quarter, the teams battled evenly until Hague's field goal.

Cooperative Group is Off-Campus Arm of College of Agriculture



I AM 50 years young and I've plenty of spunk in me. I'm not a native Ohioan, but I sure like it here. Actually, I was born in Washington, D.C., in 1914, when Congress passed the Smith-Lever Act.

Believe it or not, there were members of my family already busy in nine Ohio counties before Washington found out about us. My family, like yours, has grown. Today, there are 375 of us serving every county in Ohio, helping farmers, homemakers, industry, and many others put to use the latest information that science has to offer in the fields

of agriculture and home economics.

Who am I? I'm the Cooperative Extension Service—the off-campus arm of the College of Agriculture and Home Economics of The Ohio State Uni-

versity. Backing me up is a corps of trained specialists and researchers at the University, the Ohio Agricultural Experiment Station in Wooster, and the United States Department of Agriculture.

I got my name because of the joint effort and taxes paid by you at the county, state, and national levels.

Today, you are spending about 19 cents of every dollar of your take-home pay for food, economists say, and you are eating better than ever before. 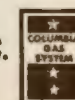

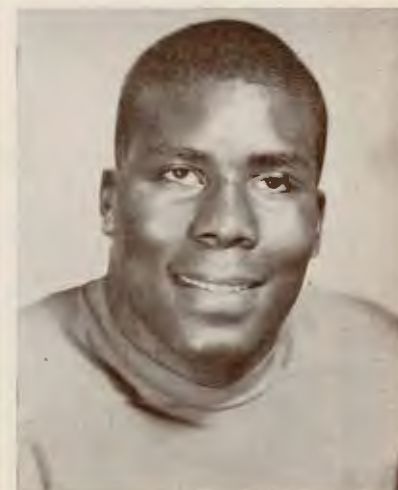

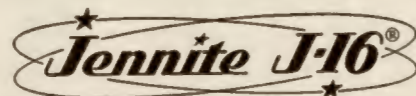
