The General Office of the Institute is located in Columbus, in the office of the State Inspector of Mines, in which the annual meeting of the Institute is held on Wednesday following the second Tuesday in January, at 7 o'clock P. THE OHIO MINING JOURNAL is the official organ of the Ohio Institute, and is owned and controlled by that body.
