The Kensington Quadrangle covers an area of approximately 50 square miles in northeastern Carroll County and southwestern Columbiana County. Kensington is the largest town in the area.

The principal mineral resource is coal. Both the Upper Freeport and the Mahoning Coals are mined underground and by stripping. Shale is used for brick at Summitville. The report discusses these coals and also the extent and possibilities of other mineral resources, such as clay, limestone, sandstone, oil and gas, salt, and sand and gravel.

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
