
Field Manual of Trees by John H. Schaffner, is a convenient pocket manual for the study of trees at any season of the year. It includes in its area Southern Canada and the Northern United States to the Southern boundary of Virginia, Kentucky, and Missouri, westward to the limits of the Prairie. It contains among other things a key to the genera of trees in the summer condition; a key to the genera of trees in the winter condition; a general key to the families and genera based on the flowers; a key to the fruits and a general classification of the wood.
