

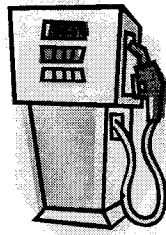

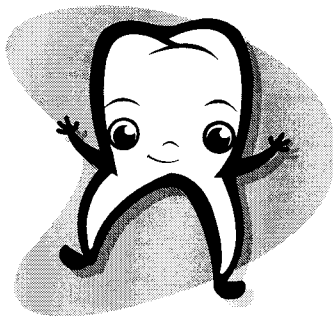

Dental Hygiene Clinic

The Rhodes State Dental Hygiene Clinic in Cook Hall is accepting patients for teeth cleaning. Appointments are available from mid-February to the end of Winter Quarter. The clinic welcomes all students, faculty, and staff of the Lima Campus to make an appointment by calling 419-995-8346 or stop over to the clinic in Cook Hall (next to the library). Community patients are also welcome.

Services provided include teeth cleaning, oral health instructions, oral cancer screening, diabetic screening, bitewing x-rays, fluoride treatment, tooth desensitization, and nutritional counseling. Cleanings are FREE for students, faculty, and staff; however, a nominal fee is charged for panoramic and cmx x-rays. Dental hygiene students are supervised by licensed dental professionals.

- ◆ Friday: 9:00-1:00 P.M.



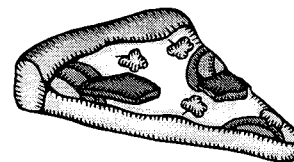
Attention Clubs!

3. At the end of the period of promotion (May 15, 2006) the club that has brought in the highest total wins a free Pizza Party and the knowledge that they helped fund the local literacy council.

The council helps the nearly 25% of the Lima adult population that can't read learn to do so. We also help understand the medical jargon that encounter in medical offices through an enhanced form of instruction with the office staff.

Learning Center

The Rhodes State Learning Center has brought on several new tutors to help students reinforce their material. The Math/Science Skills Center is open Monday – Thursday from 8am – 8pm and Friday from 8am – 5pm with walk-in tutoring in all Mathematics courses as well as Biology (Basic skills and Anatomy and Physiology) and Chemistry courses.

For those who need to work with Anatomy models, we have them ready and available to use. All of this occurs in SCI-240.

The Learning Center is also open Monday – Thursday from 8am – 8pm and Friday from 8am – 5pm but also Saturday from 9am – 1pm. TLC is located in SCI-151. Walk-in tutoring is available for writing courses, accounting principles, computer software (Microsoft Office Suite) and internet course support. Specialized course support is also available but on an appointment basis.

Come on in and visit either center. It's your home base while on campus to find friends, a quiet setting to study and also get support when needed.

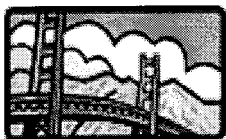
