While the Chemical Engineering Department was directly concerned with the meeting, the entire College of Engineering was being compared with other technical

training institutions, and the entire University was being regarded through the eyes of those who appreciate their own schools.

That the meeting was a success, there is no doubt. We only hope that our visitors took back with them, besides much valuable safety training, a favorable impression of our Ohio State University.
