GEOLOGY LAB OPEN HOUSE

On Wednesday, April 26, 1978, there will be an "Open House" in the Geology Department's Lab (Room 305 Galvin) from 8 AM to 5 PM. The new mineral, rock, and fossil collections will be on display. The Department has acquired natural diamonds, gold, and a natural emerald. Visitors will be able to see what rocks and minerals look like when viewed through a polarizing microscope. Cassette movies will be available to illustrate geologic principles. A stream table, showing the erosional and depositional effects of streams will also be on display. Weather instruments that will be set up in the new weather station will also be shown. Guided tours will be conducted periodically during the day. The public is invited.

there will be a slide presentation on the Metropolitan Park District in Room 160.

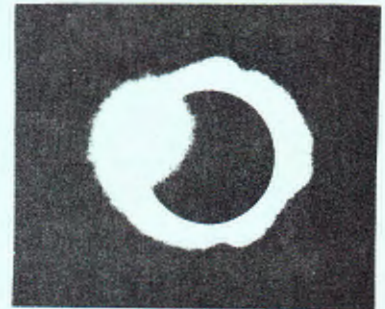

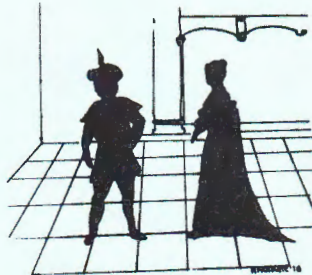
