“No other concept in biology has been as controversial as the idea of organic evolution. As everybody knows, you just don’t argue about religion or politics, and evolution strikes right at the heart of religious belief for many people. The idea that humankind has had a long history of evolutionary change, sharing common descent with other primates, is seen as a direct challenge to a literal interpretation of the Bible. In fact, in 1925, John T. Scopes, a biology teacher from Dayton, Tennessee, was placed on trial and convicted for teaching evolution in his high school class. This famous trial, known as the Scopes ‘Monkey Trial’, was the subject of various stage and film productions of *Inherit The Wind*, each version reflecting the social context of the time.” -Prof. Micheal Cunningham

The Medical Assisting Technology program at LTC has received official notification from CAAHEP (Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs) of their granting initial accreditation to MAT-LTC. This means that the MAT program meets the nationally recognized standards and guidelines for the Medical Assisting profession as prescribed by CAAHEP and the American Association of Medical Assistants Curriculum Review Board. In addition, our graduates are now eligible to sit for the Certification exams held in January and June. Achievement of accreditation has been in the works since May of 1998. MAT at LTC is one of the first, if not the first, programs in the country to be reviewed under the newly established 1999 Standards and Guidelines.

A History of the Underground Railroad

Cathy Nelson is Social Studies Curriculum Coordinator for Columbus Public Schools and has been an educator for twenty-three years. An extensive traveler and researcher of the Underground Railroad Movement, she is founder and president of the Friends of Freedom Society and state coordinator of the Ohio Underground Railroad Association. During the nineteenth century, white abolitionists and slave and free blacks cooperated to help hide and transport runaway slaves on their dangerous journey to freedom. Ohio played a prominent role in this movement, and this slide-illustrated presentation describes a history of the Underground Railroad and particular stations throughout the state.

Guidelines: Students may submit a maximum of one essay per year, and the essay must have been completed for an academic class at OSU-Lima. Submissions are welcome from all across the curriculum. Entries should not contain a grade or any comments from a professor. A student's name should not appear anywhere on the essay; instead, the student's social security number should be placed on every page and also on the entry form. Submissions will not be returned, so please do not submit an only copy.

Entry Deadline: Essays and entry forms should be submitted to 435 Galvin Hall (Faculty Services) by no later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 15, 2001. Late entries will not be accepted.

Judging Procedures: The Writing Center tutors, under the supervision of the Coordinators for The Writing Center and Writing Across the Curriculum, will select the winning entries. In the unlikely event that no entry is deemed worthy of the award, the judges reserve the right not to award a winner. Winners will be announced on May 29, 2001.

In many ways, the Northern soldier in the Civil War fought as if he had never left home. On campsites and battlefields, the Union volunteer adapted to military life with attitudes shaped by networks of family relationships, in units of men from the same hometown. Understanding these links between the homes the troops left behind and the war they had to fight offers critical insight into how they thought, fought, and persevered through four bloody years of combat. The author, Reid Mitchell, draws on the letters, diaries, and memoirs of common soldiers to show how mid-nineteenth-century ideas and images of the home and family shaped the union soldier's approach to everything from military discipline to battlefield bravery.
