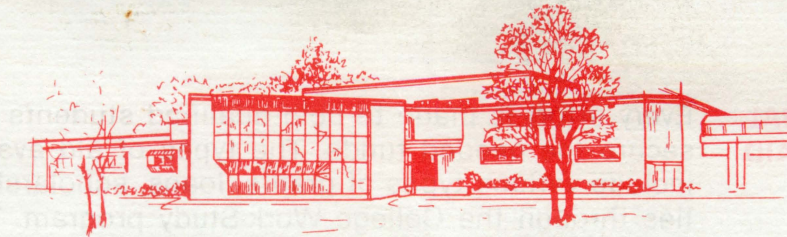


# ATI FACTS

**LOCATION**

Adjacent to the campus of the Ohio Agricultural Research and Development Center in Wooster, Ohio — situated 30 miles southwest of Akron and easily accessible from all parts of Ohio.

**SIZE**

Approximately 750 students; co-educational.

**FACILITIES**

The 42-acre central campus includes two major buildings, an ornamental horticulture complex and a residence hall accommodating 186 students. Nearby facilities include a 1500-acre farm; beef, sheep, swine and dairy operations; and horsebarns and indoor/outdoor horse arena.

**ACADEMIC  
PROGRAM**

Throughout the two years, students take a blend of general and basic courses and technical studies in their field of specialization. In technical courses, a "hands-on" practical approach is emphasized. The ATI faculty, more than 50% with Ph.D. degrees, has extensive industry experience.

**INTERNSHIP**

Occupational internship is a requirement of each technology and consists of ten to sixteen weeks of full-time employment in the student's field of study. The student is graded on job performance and receives academic credit while being paid by his employer.

**PLACEMENT**

Placement of ATI graduates in their field of study has been exceptionally good. For current figures, contact the ATI Placement Office.

**COSTS\***

Ohio Resident Fees: \$531 quarterly  
Nonresidents add tuition surcharge: \$870 quarterly  
Expenses will vary with the individual student's type of housing, meals, etc. For non-commuting Ohio residents, the approximate costs for full-time students during the 1984-85 academic year range from \$4,300 to \$4,700. These figures include the cost of fees, books, housing and meals.

**FINANCIAL AID**

Every effort is made to help qualified students with limited financial resources secure the needed funds. The types of aid available to qualified ATI students include various types of grants, loans, scholarships and employment opportunities through the College Work-Study program. The student must complete the Financial Aid Form (FAF), the Ohio Instructional Grant (OIG) application (Ohio residents only), and The Ohio State University Scholarship and Financial Aid application by the deadline dates.

**ADMISSION**

ATI applications for admission may be requested from The Ohio State University Admissions Office or from the Institute. Students may apply for admission for any quarter.

Prior to admission, students should arrange a personal conference with the faculty member representing their field of interest. Applicants will be recommended for admission as individual program enrollment ceilings permit.

Freshman applicants are urged to take the American College Test (ACT — preferred) or Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) and submit their applications in the autumn or early winter for the following Autumn Quarter. Transfer student applicants should submit their applications at least six months in advance of their intended enrollment.

**HIGH SCHOOL PREPARATION**

The following minimum high school preparation is strongly recommended for entering freshmen: at least two units of science, not including general science; three units of college-preparatory mathematics; four units of English; and two units of social studies. In some instances, vocational agriculture or horticulture may be helpful in addition to the above.

**HOUSING**
