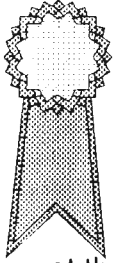

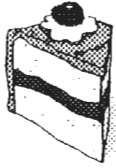

JOIN THE NEW DEBATE CLUB

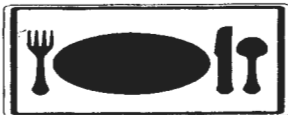
