There will be a "Pizza With The President" party with members of 2 honorary Societies, University Scholars Program, and members of the Academy Program, where Psi Chi, the Psychology Honorary, will induct Gee as an honorary member. ## JOE ARONSON SINGS JEWISH MUSIC ON WEDNESDAY



Jewish folksinger and storyteller Joe Aronson will present his "A RECENT HISTORY OF THE JEWS (in song and story) in Reed Hall Room 160 at noon on Wednesday, November 8. The program starts with the melodies of the *shtetls*, the small ghetto villages of Eastern Europe in which Jews lived, to the music played during the waves of emigration to the new world in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, through the Holocaust and on to the songs of the struggle for a Jewish homeland. Joe Aronson has been playing and singing for audiences for 30 years, starting in the coffee houses of the 60's. His factual and well researched material gives a true picture of the immigrants' struggles. He invites your questions after the performance

## THE "CHIMP" LADY IS COMING TO LIMA CAMPUS

Don't tell Sarah Boysen that chimps don't count. They not only count, they can add and subtract! Dr. Boysen, affectionately known as The Chimp Lady to comparative psychology co-workers, faculty, staff and students at OSU Columbus, has been immersed since 1983 in exploration of the cognitive abilities in chimps, monkeys, dogs and pigs. At 7:30 pm. on Wednesday, November 8, she will bring her research results, videos and animal anecdotes from the Comparative Cognition Project to the Reed Hall auditorium for a video and lecture presentation. Tickets for the lecture are \$3.00 and can be purchased in the Student Activities Office in GA 066. In The Comparative Cognition Project dogs and pot-bellied pigs as well as chimpanzees are learning to understand gestural communication like rudimentary sign language. Boysen conducts her studies at the Chimp Center, located on the OSU Columbus campus. Recently, there were ground breaking ceremonies to begin construction of a new Primate Discovery Center where students of all ages will be able to watch the animals in a classroom setting, use hands-on learning, a resource library, a variety of media for learning and the ability to go outside to see the animals in a zoo-like setting. **Students are invited to meet Dr. Boysen on Wednesday afternoon from 2:00-3:00 in Reed Hall Room 160.**

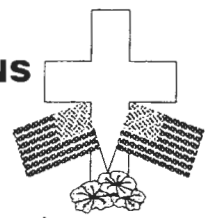

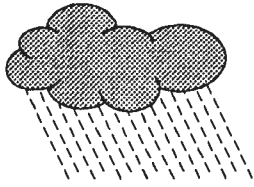

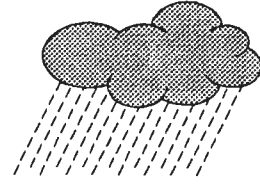
### OSU PRESIDENT TO FLIP COIN FOR FLAG FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT
