This Article examines the history of opioid litigation and the typical litigation pathways for those injured. Among other actors, the Article discusses Purdue Pharma's marketing practices and unsuccessful personal injury cases brought against them by private individuals. In considering the difficulties in adjudicating and settling mass opioid litigations, the Article argues that the current litigation pathways are incapable of resolving these issues and providing relief to those injured.
