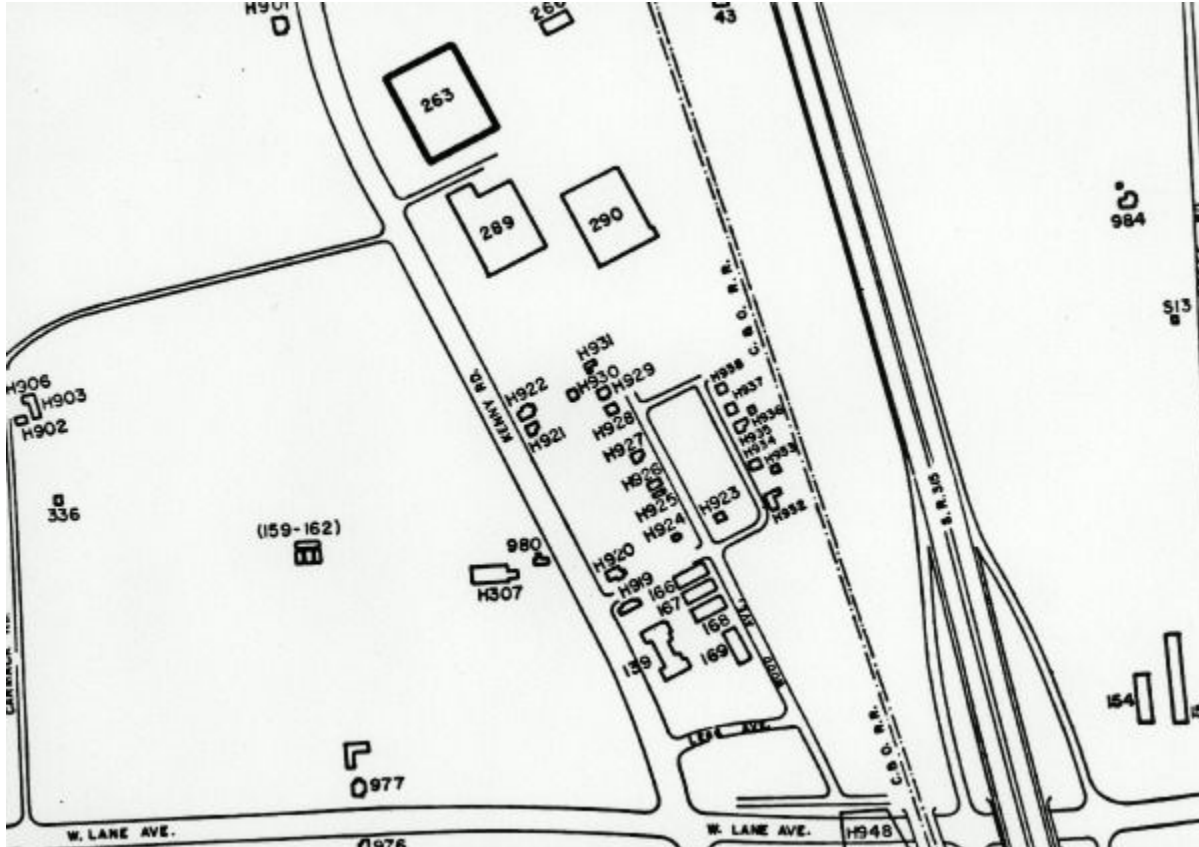

3. General Description

3.1 Type of construction:

Steel frame with sheet metal exterior.

3.2 No. of stories:

One story.

3.3 Increments of construction:

No additions. However, several small temporary structures have been created around the outside of the building.

B. PLANNING & CONSTRUCTION

1. On February 11, 1965 the Board of Trustees approved the plans and related documents prepared by W. E. Linch and authorized the solicitation of bids by contractors.

2. Bids were received on February 19, 1965 (T).

3. On April 8, 1965 the Board of Trustees awarded contracts to the following contractors:

General: Service Products Buildings. Inc.

Plumbing: Limback Co.

4. Bids on utilities were received on April 27, 1965 (T) and on May 13, 1965 the contract was awarded to K & I Construction Co.

5. On March 11, 1965 the Board of Trustees approved plans and related documents prepared by W. E. Linch for construction of temporary veterinary clinic facilities within the building and authorized construction by force account.

6. Completion and occupancy:

6.1 The general contract was completed June 30, 1965; the other three by August 1, 1965 (A).

6.2 The first patients were admitted in October 1965 according to Dr. Whiteus.

6.3 Initial assignments for use of the space were issued November 22, 1965 (P).

C. COST

The contracts awarded on April 8, 1965 and May 13, 1965 totaled \$230,804.57. The Business office report for June 30, 1966 lists the project at \$757,921.85.

E. MISCELLANEOUS

1. The building was designed as a motor pool garage to replace the garage facilities in Building 032. It was equipped as a temporary veterinary clinic, with the understanding that Veterinary Medicine would vacate the facility upon completion of its new building (Building 299).

2. The veterinary clinic is now in process of moving to Building 299.

ADDENDUM NO. 2

The animal runs and waste storage on the south side and the construction on the west side, referred to in Addendum No. 1, were a part of the original construction; they were not temporary additions, as stated in 3.3 of part of the main body of this report.

This building is currently being remodeled for use as a motor pool garage, office equipment repair shop, and warehouse under contracts reported to the Board of Trustees on May 6, 1977.

ADDENDUM NO. 4

Assignments in the remodeled building were made to Office Equipment Repair and to the Transportation and Garage Division on March 20, 1978. (P)

In making these assignments, the building was called "Temporary Veterinary Clinic."

A new name for the building is currently being sought. At the present time a sign at the building says "University Services Center," and this name will probably appear in the next directory.

The Board of Trustees on October 6, 1978 changed the name of this building to "Service Building Annex."

ADDENDUM NO. 6

West of the northern half of the building were two square metal buildings, as shown on Sheet 29 in the book of campus maps in the University Archives. This particular copy of Sheet 29 is undated except for

the date of the aerial photography (1967).

These two detached buildings were used for storage of hay and straw. They were not a part of the original construction. However, Professor Robert Whiteus, Director of the Veterinary Hospital, reports that they were there when Building 263 opened. (October 1965)

In the summer of 1977, these two detached buildings were removed from this area and reconstructed elsewhere as one building, now designated Building 134.

The same Sheet 29 shows two attached projections on the west side of the building. The one to the north shows on the architect's plans and was part of the original construction.

The one to the south does not show on the original drawings. It was a cold room for storage of dead animals. According to Professor Whiteus, it was available for use at the time of opening of the building (October 1965) or shortly thereafter.

The cold room is separated from the main building by a few feet, but its roof extends to the west wall of the main building.
