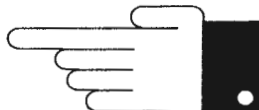
"HEALTHY BALANCE" COMING SOON

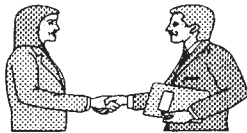
