### BARON BASKETBALL

19 Nov 77 - After winning the first game of the season the "BARONS" managed to hold off a late rally by the Rio Grande "Redmen" to up their season mark to 2-0. The BARONS, led by Mark Vorst with 21 points and Joe Stubblefield and Mike Rehmert with 11 each, took a 10 point lead to the locker room at half time. During the second half, however, the "Redmen" came back and with just 40 seconds remaining on the clock, trailed by one point, when John Klausung came up with two key interceptions and the "BARONS" went on to win by a final score of 73-68.

### BARON BASKETBALL (cont'd)

20 Nov 77 - On Sunday, November 20th, the "BARONS" traveled to Piqua where they took on the "Chargers" of Edison State. It was a high scoring affair but the "BARONS" came out on the short end of a 112-93 final score. Mark Vorst once again led the Baron scoring attack with 28 points while Joe Stubblefield and Steve Kratzenberg chipped in 16 and 15 points respectively. In addition to his 16 points Joe Stubblefield also pulled down 15 rebounds in what was his best individual performance of the young season.

23 Nov 77 - The BARONS' season record skidded to 2-2 Wednesday night as they lost to Michael J. Owens Tech. College at Perrysburg in what had to be their poorest performance of the year. The BARONS could manage only 36 team rebounds and shot a meager 28% from the floor as they suffered their second loss in as many outings by a final score of 85-62. Steve Kratzenberg and Mark Vorst collected 32 of the BARON tallies with 20 and 12 points respectively.

26 Nov 77 - The league leading Hilltoppers of O.U. Chillicothe came to town on Saturday night and handed the BARONS their first league defeat of the season by a narrow two point margin. Strong board work by Joe Stubblefield, Dave Luzader and Mark Vorst gave the BARONS a 35-29 advantage at half time, but during the second half turnovers inabled Chillicothe to get back in the game. With just 4 seconds remaining on the clock the Hilltoppers took the lead and the BARONS lost a heart breaker by a final score of 69-67.
